KEY MOMENTS IN THEIR HISTORY

- Formed in 1940 as Salford Central, and then became known as Salford Amateurs, hence their nickname of the Ammies.
- Achieved success in the 1970s which included local cups and leagues.
- Entered the FA Cup for the first time in 1990
- A second successive promotion from the North West Counties League in 2008 secured their place in the Unibond League
- Taken over by the Class of 92 – Gary Neville, Phil Neville, Ryan Giggs, Paul Scholes and Nicky Butt -- in 2014
- Defeated Notts County in the first round of the FA Cup in 2015, before going out to Hartlepool in the next round.
- Under managers Anthony Johnson and Bernard Morley won back-to-back promotions to the National North in 2016. They finished second behind Quakers in the EvoStik League.
- The club is progressing with redevelopments of their ground, and a new stand was recently formally opened by Sir Alex Ferguson

Salford City moved nine points clear at the top of the National League North after a gritty 1-0 win at Blyth Spartans. The Ammies started out the better side, but it was Spartans who almost opened the scoring through Dan Maguire from a shot just inside the area but Max Crocombe saved well for Salford. Former Quaker Dale Hopson also missed an opportunity for Blyth, but sliced well wide. Michael Liddle narrowly headed wide for Salford, but they broke the deadlock on 36 minutes. Jack Redshaw got in behind the home defence and our former keeper Pete Jameson brought him down, with the referee pointing to the spot. Redshaw picked himself up and planted the penalty in the corner to give the Ammies the lead. The hosts pushed for a quick response and despite three Salford players being yellow carded in the minutes before half time Blyth were unable to level.

The second half was played at a frantic pace. Salford could have doubled their lead through Redshaw, but he fired high and wide after creating space in the

box. At the other end Dan Maguire twice had efforts to level, but both missed the target.

Spartans kept pushing and thought they had levelled through a drive from Jarett Rivers, but Anthony Dudley cleared off the line. Hopson and sub Adam Wrightson also missed chances for the home side, before Robbie Dale also had a shot cleared in the final minutes, as Salford hung on for their seventh straight victory in the league.

The managerial duo joined the Ammies in January 2015 replacing Phil Power. They had previously been in charge of Ramsbottom United where they led the club to new heights. Two promotions saw them take the club from the North West Counties League to the Evo-Stik Premier League. This included a playoff semi-

final victory over ourselves at Heritage Park. Their success continued from the word go at Salford, as they led the side to two successive promotions alongside us, as both clubs climbed into the National North. Both were former semi-professional players with Johnson playing for Salford.

Jack Redshaw

- The 26-year-old Salford born forward started out with Manchester City's academy side at the age of 9 and signed his first professional contract with them in 2008. Two years later he joined Rochdale where he made 3 first team appearances.



A move to Salford City followed and Jack scored sixteen goals in twenty-six appearances before signing for Altrincham. Jack's quality was plain to see and after a short but successful spell at Moss Lane he was signed by League Two Morecambe in January 2012. Following 120 league appearances for the Shrimpers (with 36 goals scored) Jack moved to Blackpool in 2015. A tricky, goalscoring forward Jack was released during the summer of 2017 and accepted an offer to sign a two-year contact with his home city club. A real coup for the Ammies and he announced his return in style, scoring twice against former club Blackpool in a pre-season game at Moor Lane.



Richie Allen - Attacking midfielder / striker who signed from AFC Fylde in September 2015. Richie attained genuine 'legend' status with The Coasters and up until his departure no player had contributed more goals to their cause. Richie weighed in with seventeen goals during the 2015-2016 season, including a cracker in front of the BBC's cameras as the Ammies beat Notts County in the FA Cup first round. With his buccaneering style and ability to conjure spectacular goals he became a firm favourite with Salford supporters and accepted an offer to turn full-time during the summer of 2017.

Michael Nottingham - Tall defender who was an integral part of the Solihull Moors side that won the National League North title in 2016. Michael can operate as a right-back, central defender or wing-back and has a real eye for a goal, notching eleven in all competitions last season. Started out with Romulus and Redditch United before moving to Gresley where he was selected for the Evostik League First Division South's team of the season. That fine form earned a move to Solihull Moors on 2013 and Michael had a great

campaign in 2015-2016, picking up the players' and supporters' player-of-the-year awards as well as a divisional winner's medal. He carried that form on at Moor Lane and after a great first season with Salford City was named as the supporters' player-of-the-year as well as

being selected in the National League North team of the season.

SALFORD- LAST SEASON

Following back-to-back promotions Salford came into the National North with expectations of another good season and they got off to a flying start. They won six of their first eight games, as they made an undefeated start to the campaign which included a 3-3 draw with title rivals Fylde. However, they went on a run of seven games without a win which included four defeats, a spell that would prove costly. The run saw them slip from top spot to tenth in the league. The managerial duo

were able to turn their fortunes back around, as they quickly climbed back into the playoff places, with heavy wins over Kidderminster Harriers and a 5-0 destruction of leaders Fylde which pushed them up to second as the season entered the final months.

The table was very tight except for leaders Fylde, but costly draws, as well as defeats at Boston United and Gainsborough Trinity left Salford in real trouble trying to make the top five. In their last three games they needed three wins and they got them including a 5-1 victory against us on the final day at Moor Lane to secure a playoff spot.

In the playoff semi finals they met Halifax Town, with both legs finishing all square. However, it was Halifax who held their nerve to win the penalty shoot out 3-1, as they moved into the final and clinched promotion.

Quakers produced a magnificent performance to win at promotion favourites Salford, both goals scored by David Ferguson.

The midfielder scored late in each half to give Quakers the three points, and not many inside Moor Lane could argue that Quakers deserved to win.

There was some early promise for Quakers when Beck nodded down a Cillies cross for David Syers to have a shot blocked ten yards out.

Quakers had a good chance when a long throw by Brown came in from the left, and Syers was inches wide at the far post.

There was some great trickery by James Caton on the left when he dribbled past a defender and whipped in a dangerous cross that was headed away by a defender.

Salford posed danger when Mani Dieseruwwe broke down the right and crossed into the middle, where Mike Phenix failed to control the ball with just Bartlett to beat.

Quakers took the lead on 43 minutes when Caton burst through and struck the bar, and the ball rebounded out for David Ferguson to control, then he coolly stroked the ball into the bottom right hand corner from the edge of the area.

Quakers were pushed back at the start of the second half, but again defended well. Dieseruwwe mishit his shot from 10 yards but Phenix could only divert the ball into Bartlett's hands, then Lois Maynard set up Dieseruwwe, but he could only fire straight at Bartlett from twelve yards.

Richie Allen cut in from the right and curled a left foot shot just over, and Phenix burst through one-on-one, and blazed wildly over the bar.

But Quakers overcame that spell of pressure, and started to gain more of a foothold in the game. And in stoppage time Quakers caught Salford with a quick counter-attack, when sub Harvey Saunders broke down the right hand side, beat a defender, and then rolled the ball across the 18 yard box for Ferguson to slide past the stranded keeper.

Craig Stoddart and Ray Simpson have been keeping an eye on the activities of former Darlo players.



AMAR PUREWAL WINS AWARD

Former Darlo favourite **Amar Purewal** has won a prestigious award.

Amar, who left us last season, won the Asian non league footballer of the year award at a dinner in London, pipping his brother Arjun. Amar said: "I was over the moon to win, it's not something you expect to be nominated for when you are up north, because there's not as many Asian players as there are down south. To win it was quite an achievement.

"I clinched it on the night, but we are big supporters of each other, so I feel like we both won."

Arjun said: "He wanted me to win and I wanted him to win, so whoever won was going to feel bad for the other one, but if I had to lose to anyone I'm glad it was my brother."

Together with Arjun, another former Darlo player, they

collected the team of the year award on behalf of the Panjab FA for doing well in the Conifa World Cup last year. Amar was the top scorer in the competition.

Former Darlington defender **Ben Purkiss** has been elected chairman of the Professional Footballers Association.

Purkiss played twelve games for us in season 2011-12, and is currently at Swindon Town after moving there from Port Vale during the summer.

"I'm really looking forward to doing my best for players up and down the country," he said. "I've been part of the management committee for five years and supported Ritchie Humphries, so I'm not coming in blind. I understand the scale of the role and I'm not daunted by it.

"It's difficult to describe. I'm proud, honoured. You look back through the list of chairs and there haven't been that many."

PFA chief executive Gordon Taylor added: "We congratulate Ben on his selection as chairman and feel sure his vast experience as a player and management committee member make him eminently suitable for the position.

"Ben is articulate, forward thinking and knowledgeable about the Association and very well respected in the game amongst his fellow professionals, showing all the characteristics you need to be a chairman of the PFA."

Dan Burn was in the national spotlight last weekend, playing in Wigan Athletic's FA Cup second round tie at AFC Fylde televised live on BBC2.

The towering centre-back's team drew 1-1. Wigan pegged back by a late goal scored by Danny Rowe.

Burn came through the ranks with Quakers, making his debut as a teenager in 2009.

Danny Graham was on target when Blackburn threw away a 3-0 lead to draw 3-3 with League Two strugglers Crewe Alexandra in the FA Cup.

Tony Mowbray's League One side were in complete control after taking a 3-0 lead inside 20 minutes. Graham's goal making it 2-0, but later Rovers had two men sent off and Crewe clawed their way back into the contest to earn a replay.

Graham was on loan at Darlington in 2004 from Middlesbrough.

Nathan Cartman scored on his debut for Farsley Celtic in the EvoStik Premier Division, just a day after signing for them from Quakers.

It took him just ten minutes to score against Stafford Rangers, and set up a 2-0 win. He had a loan spell at Farsley earlier in the season when he scored twice.

Farsley manager Adam

Lakeland said: "I am absolutely delighted to welcome Nathan back to the football club. He is a player I have admired for a long time, a natural goal scorer and a proven goal scorer.

"We had him on loan at the start of the season and I thought he applied himself really well. His movement and pace proved a real threat, and the only disappointment was his goal output in that month. Ultimately his partnership up front didn't work just as we would have liked.

"I really feel we've got the ideal fit with Nathan coming to the club. He's local, he's at the right age as he's in his prime at 28, and most importantly he wants to play for Farsley Celtic. I am really looking forward to linking up with him again."

When Cartman arrived, another former Darlo striker,

James Walshaw, left for Scarborough Athletic.

Ryan Bowman finished on the losing side in a controversial Scottish League Cup final for Motherwell against Celtic. The game turned on a hotly-disputed penalty for a foul on Celtic's Scott Sinclair early in the second half.

"It is important to take things on. 100 per cent," said Bowman. "You can feel sorry for yourselves and let the season drift away, but we are better than that.

"As the manager says, as hard as it may be, we have to dust ourselves down, pick ourselves up as quickly as possible as we have a game just as big as Hampden on Wednesday night.

"It's been a totally different season. From a relegation battle to the top six. But we have to push on. Like I said, we can't just drift off. We have to keep going and going. As players, we know what we are trying to do. Everyone knows their jobs and what we are trying to do.

"There is a great team spirit in the changing room at the moment."





UNDER THE MICROSCOPE

Reece Styche

Quakers' new centre forward Reece Styche was an instant hit when he scored twice on his debut against Harrogate Town in our last home game. He spoke to Ray Simpson.

Wherever Reece has played in his career and felt happy, he's always scored goals, and hopefully after scoring twice against Harrogate on his debut, he'll feel happy with us!

He started his career at Hednesford, and played for Grantham, Coalville and Shepshed Dynamo before moving in October 2009 to Chasetown, where he discovered a proper goalscoring touch. He scored 13 goals in 15 matches for Chasetown, and that was enough to earn him a move to Conference club Forest Green Rovers just three months later. Just a day after signing, he scored twice on his debut after coming on as a sub against Hayes and Yeading, and that signalled the start of a prosperous spell.

"I did really well at Forest Green, and I enjoyed my football there the most," he said. "The manager at the time, Dave Hockaday believed in me, and when you've got that in a manager, like Tommy Wright has believed in me, you play your best football."

It was when he was at Forest Green that he became firm friends with Tommy, the two of them playing up front near the end of the 2011-12 season. At that point, Tommy had joined Forest Green from Luton Town, and they travelled to training and matches together.

Reece was a regular scorer at Forest Green, and scored 16 in his first full season, as well as attracting a £75,000 offer from Luton Town. He also earned an England C international cap, but disaster struck in February 2013 when he suffered a cruciate injury after a damaged knee in 2011 -- and didn't play for another eight months.

"I started the season the 2011-12 season really well, and scored six goals in seven games. I had a pain in my knee and thought it was just a cartilage tear, but it was something much worse than that, and I was out for six months.

"Ironically, Luton had just offered £75,000 for me, but Forest Green turned it down and offered me a three-year deal which

I signed. Then the injury happened just a week or so later. Maybe it happened that way for a reason."

It was on his return from the second injury that he joined Wycombe in the Football League on loan until the rest of the 2013-14 season, but the move didn't work - probably because of that long spell without playing. "I tried to play too soon after the injury, and I didn't really do myself justice." To make matters worse, he was also released by Forest Green at the end of the season, after scoring 35 goals in 108 games for them.

It was during his brief stay at Wycombe that he was called up to the Gibraltar squad for friendly games against the Faroe Islands and Estonia. He qualified to represent the territory by virtue of his grandmother coming from the little country based on the rock overlooking the Mediterranean.

"I was very proud to represent my country, but I couldn't understand how unprofessional some of the other players were,

and I made my views known. I thought that some of them were only there for the money, and weren't bothered about losing. We conceded a goal in a game because someone didn't track his runner and I let him know, so he complained about me.

"It was all very political, it wasn't a good environment and I didn't want to play for them any more."

He joined Kidderminster Harriers, and after four months he was loaned out to Tamworth without his knowledge! "Going to Kidderminster was the worst move I'd ever made. I nearly quit football because I was so unhappy there.

"It got to the point in which I didn't want to be there, and the club didn't want me there. I was shopping one day and got a call from the Tamworth manager, Andy Morrell, to talk about a loan move. I didn't even know that the move had been lined up.

"So, I went to Tamworth on loan and enjoyed myself, and went back to Kidderminster for the start of the following season 2015-16. After a couple of months, I went to Macclesfield on loan,

and after I was freed by Kidderminster, I went to Gateshead."

The Gateshead move didn't go well, and so he had a loan spell at Nuneaton under Tommy, and another loan spell at Tamworth, whom he joined on a permanent basis in the summer.

Clearly, Reece enjoyed his football at Tamworth, and he was the league's fourth highest scorer with ten when he signed for us last month.

"The main factor in joining Darlington was Tommy. I've known him since I was at Forest Green when we used to travel together and got on really well.

"He took me down to Nuneaton after Gateshead, and he was a main part in me starting to enjoy my football again. Thanks to him, and the Tamworth manager Andy Morrell - I got my love back for football.

"It was a tough decision to leave Tamworth. But Tommy has looked after me, Darlington get big crowds, and they're a big club who shouldn't be in this league. I'm excited to come and play for Tommy again.

"In the last year or so I've found that common ground of enjoying the

game and not taking football as seriously as I had been doing over the previous couple of years. At the moment, I'm in a good place and hopefully that will continue at Darlington.

"Gary Brown will tell you that I'm not a nice bloke to play against and I just think that the more you can unsettle your opposition regardless of how you do it, then that can give you that edge. I'm quite direct as a striker, and sometimes I find my scoring boots which is always a good thing. I just like to get into people's faces, I work hard and I like getting hold of the ball and taking people on.

"In the last couple of years sometimes I've been more like a number 10, dropping into the hole but that isn't me. My energy is making runs into the box and into the channels. I like to make half a yard for myself so I can run at someone, get past a defender and get a shot off on goal.

"I want to carry on enjoying my football, as long as I'm doing that, then everything else takes care of itself. I want to work hard because working hard brings you rewards."

HOW THE OTHERS ARE DOING

Today's visitors Salford City are cantering away with the division, leading by nine points with just one league defeat since the opening day of the season. They're also unbeaten away from home this campaign.

The Ammies' hold on top spot was consolidated when Harrogate Town dropped points in a dramatic 2-2 draw at home to Kidderminster in midweek. Simon Ainge thought he'd won the game for Harrogate with a goal in stoppage time, only for Joe Ironside to equalise in the 93rd minute.

That draw took Harrogate above Brackley on goal difference, with both sides nine points adrift of Salford. The Saints have six wins in their last seven.

Blyth Spartans remain firmly in the play-off places, despite three defeats in their last six. They lost 1-0 at home to Salford last weekend to fall 14 points behind the leaders.

5th-placed Spennymoor are two points further adrift, but with a game in hand. They return to league action this afternoon, three weeks after suffering a heavy 4-0 reverse at Leamington.

The season's surprise package are arguably Bradford Park Avenue. They sit in the play-off places after four straight league wins, although they lost to Northern Premier League side Stourbridge in a FA Trophy replay. And Kidderminster complete the top seven, moving a point clear of their nearest challengers after the midweek draw at Harrogate.

Chorley lie just outside the top seven after losing only one of their last eight league games. The Magpies are also unbeaten in their last four.

A further point back are York City, whose patchy form has seen them win three, lose three and draw two in the league since Martin Gray took over.

10th-placed Tamworth are also struggling for form, after winning only one of their last five

- that victory coming against Darlington at Blackwell Meadows.

Stockport County are five points behind the play-off places after an inconsistent run of form, which has seen them win two, lose two and draw two of their last six.

They're a point ahead of AFC Telford, who ended a run of four league games without a win by beating Tamworth 2-0 last month.

Curzon Ashton have slipped six points behind the play-off places after taking just two points from their previous four matches.

14th-placed Alfreton are in freefall after losing eight of their last 10.

But FC United are improving and have climbed away from the relegation zone with four wins from six matches.

17th-placed Leamington are below Darlington on goal difference only. Their recent good form has been stunted after three defeats in four games, to leave them two points above the drop zone.

Also on 22 points are Southport, who are still without a league win under new manager Kevin Davies. They haven't won a league game since beating Darlington in early September - a run of 12 matches.

Gainsborough Trinity are a point and a place above the relegation places. Their form had improved of late, although two defeats in three matches have seen them slip back into trouble.

Third-bottom Nuneaton Town are a point from safety, although they improved their prospects with victory over North Ferriby in their last league game.

Boston United defeated Martin Gray's York City last week to earn their first league win in 11 matches, a run stretching back to early September.

And North Ferriby United continue to look doomed, sitting 14 points from safety and without a league win since August.

Simon Weatherill continues his Memory Match series with our Lucky Losers FA Cup tie at Aston Villa on 11th December 1999.

The 1999/2000 FA Cup competition provided Darlington with a route into football history. Holders Manchester United decided not to enter that year's FA Cup as they were required in Brazil to play in the FIFA World Club Championship. This left the FA with 63 teams for the 3rd round draw, so they announced that one of the teams knocked out in round 2 would gain a reprieve to make up the numbers. Of the 20 balls that were placed in the hat, Darlington's ball number 14 was drawn out and the Quakers gained a unique place in FA Cup history as the competition's only ever "lucky losers". They were handed an away tie at Aston Villa.

The cup run had started with a 1st round home win, 2-1 over Southport. Steve Tutill and Marco Gabbiadini with a penalty scored the goals, but the game is probably best remembered for a man of the match performance by 17 year reserve goalkeeper Keith Finch, who replaced Andy Collett at half time. He made several superb saves to help the Quakers hang on to their victory. Their reward was a 2nd round trip to Priestfield to play Gillingham, where they were beaten 3-1, which should have ended their interest in the competition, but the draw for the lucky losers put them back in.

The tie would take place at Villa Park on December 11th. The third round had been moved from its traditional first Saturday in January slot, so that it wouldn't clash with FIFA's new club tournament.


The lead up to the cup tie saw the Quakers in a good run of form. They sat in third place in the Division 3 table, with 36 points from their 20 games so far. In their previous game they'd beaten Halifax 4-0, so confidence was high, but manager Dave Hodgson would have to make changes for the trip to Villa. Top scorer Gabbiadini would be missing through suspension, after being sent off at Southend. Gary Himsworth (rib) and Glenn Naylor (hamstring) would both miss the game through injury, as would Andy Collett, who still hadn't recovered from the injury received in the Southport game in round one. Lee Nogan replaced Gabbiadini up front and Mark Samways continued to deputise for Collett in goal. Villa, managed by John Gregory, were having a moderate season, sitting in 15th place in the Premiership with 19 points from 17 games, but their side boasted many international stars and household names. Their team to face the Quakers included David James, Gareth Southgate, Ugo Ehiogu, Gareth Barry, Paul

Merson, Steve Stone, Dion Dublin and Benito Carbone amongst others. Steve Watson was missing through injury and Villa would also be without Lee Hendrie and George Boeteng because of suspension.

A crowd of 22,101 (including over 4,000 away fans) were at Villa Park for the game. They saw the Quakers than match their illustrious opponents in the opening exchanges. In fact, it was the visitors who played most of the passing football, while the home side played a much more direct game, using top scorer Dion Dublin as a target man. The first real threat on goal came in the 18th minute when Ugo Ehiogu met an Alan Thompson corner, but his downward header was knocked off the line by Neil Aspin. Gareth Barry then had a header blocked by Mark Samways, and Dublin headed another Thompson corner just wide as Villa continued to threaten from crosses and corners. The Quakers hit back and could have taken the lead in the 29th minute. Neil Heaney cut in from the left wing and hit a right foot shot from 25 yards that David James saved, but couldn't hold. James then reacted brilliantly to block the follow up effort from Peter Duffield, somehow forcing the ball

wide off his body. Dublin put another header just wide and Italian winger Benito Carbone fired a 30 yarder just past the post as Villa continued to press. It was Carbone who finally broke the deadlock in the 43rd minute with a route one goal. James' long clearance was flicked on by Dublin to Carbone, who chested the ball down and hit a superb dipping volley over Samways from 25 yards out. The Quakers hit back and very nearly equalised before half time when Michael Oliver picked out Duffield with a cross from the right, but his header was brilliantly saved by James, acrobatically pushing the ball round the post. Half time: Aston Villa 1 Darlington 0.

Villa began the second half well on top. Alan Thompson and Ian Taylor both went close with headers, then Taylor hit a shot on the turn that rattled against the post. The home side scored a deserved second on 63 minutes when Dublin headed home a Thompson corner. It nearly got even worse for the Quakers minutes later when Paul Merson fired in a shot from the edge of the box but Samways produced the save of the afternoon to tip it round the post. Slightly against the run of play,



Darlington pulled a goal back in the 71st minute. Heaney found Duffield with a clever pass but as he raced into the box he was tripped by Barry for a clear penalty. Duffield stepped up to take the spot kick, James guessed correctly to make a superb block, but Paul Heckingbottom was the first to react and slotted the loose ball home into the opposite corner in front of the massed ranks of ecstatic travelling fans. The goal gave the Quakers fresh impetus and they charged forward looking for an equaliser. Villa were shell shocked and hanging on by the end. Duffield headed just over. Heckingbottom hit a left foot cracker that grazed

the bar and then in the closing moments substitute Jesper Hjorth nearly forced a replay with a shot across goal that was inches wide. The Quakers couldn't find another goal though and the game finished Villa 2 Darl 1. The "lucky losers" had done themselves proud and had pushed their Premiership opponents all the way.

Villa produced a 48-page programme, priced at £2. There were 4 pages covering the visiting side, packed with information and pen pictures. (Although the guy who put together the player pen pics seemed to think that Darlington were nicknamed the Shakers). The squad listings are on the back page.

REMINDER OF DARLINGTON FOOTBALL CLUB'S

GROUND REGULATIONS



We would also like to draw attention to the possession of pyrotechnics

As a member Club participating in The National League we have been directed to take the strongest action available against anyone found in possession of a Flare, Smoke Bomb or any other such pyrotechnic article(s).

Spectators are warned that we and The National League apply a zero tolerance approach to anyone attempting to bring such article(s) into our Ground/Stadium.

Due to their chemical make-up, a Flare, Smoke Bomb and all such pyrotechnic article(s) can be highly toxic for some people. This can lead to serious health consequences for those with pre-existing medical conditions and may in certain circumstances cause life-threatening injury or concern.

In order to protect you, the spectator, we reserve the right to search your person and/or effects and we further reserve the right to pursue legal action, civil or criminal, against any person who contravenes current legislation or our Ground/Stadium regulations.

To further safeguard all who attend any event at this Ground/Stadium, we welcome the receipt of any information which will assist us to deter, apprehend/detain and where appropriate prosecute, anyone in possession of, or found discharging or being a party to the discharge of, such an article(s).

In home games last season, there were incidents involving a flare, some coin throwing and fans encroaching on to the field of play. Accordingly, we have been requested to remind fans about our ground regulations.

These regrettable incidents are contrary to our ground regulations, as published on our official website on 12th October last year, and again last week.

The pertinent regulations are as follows:

"The following articles must not be brought within the Ground - knives, fireworks or any other pyrotechnics, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, glass bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles, any articles that are prohibited by the Rules and Regulations, and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to (or ejected from) the Ground."

And

"Under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended) the following are offences for which a person can be arrested by a police officer and conviction could result in a Banning Order being made under the Football Spectators Act 1989 (as amended): The list is non-exhaustive.

"The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse;

"The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse."

We should be very clear. Those responsible for such incidents simply do not care about our club, our reputation or the safety of our fans and we do not want them at our matches. The club will work with the stewards and police to ensure that these matters are addressed and the individuals will be banned from future matches.

Ensuring the safety of our supporters and staff is always of paramount importance to Darlington FC 1883. If such behaviour was to continue, the reality is it would only be a matter of time before serious injury is caused and the club in turn would be punished by the league and/or the FA. We will not allow safety to be compromised of the well-behaved and sensible majority by the actions of a tiny minority.

Two of Darlo's favourite players scored in the first 35 minutes - Barry Conlon and Neil Wainwright - with Craig James adding the third in the second half.

December 16th 2005



We were in very good shape going into the game, with three straight league wins over Shrewsbury, Brentford and Wycombe, and once Alan White put Quakers in front after just three minutes. Quakers were well on top.

Blundell then made it 2-0 on 25 minutes, with Richie Foran and Micky Cummins making it 4-0 in the last minute.

We also won our next match by the same scoreline at Lincoln City.


