Good afternoon everyone and welcome to the game.

d like to use these notes to formally welcome Tommy Wright and Alan White to the club. They don't need any introduction, because they've both been at the club before, and both of them were already well thought of.

We were very pleased to secure their services because they were outstanding in the interview process. Both of them showed a huge amount of enthusiasm and a real desire to take the club forward – hopefully to the Football League – and to strengthen its position as a club at the heart of the community. I also plan to attend the AGM of the Supporters Group on November 16th.

KEY MOMENTS IN THEIR HISTORY

- Founded in 1890 and became a prominent side in the local Northamptonshire area
- Moved to current St James Park ground in 1974
- In early 90's the club's survival was in danger and in 1992/93 they finished with the worst playing record of any senior side in the country
- Brackley were forced into voluntary liquidation in February 1999
- The 2003/04 season saw them win the Hellenic League to gain promotion back to the Southern League
- Three seasons later they gained promotion to the Southern Premier division
- They reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in 2008/09
- Arguably the club's greatest moment came at the end of the 2011/12 season when they lifted the Southern League Premier Division title to gain a place in the National North
- In 2013/14 they beat Gillingham live on TV in the FA Cup first round, a feat which they repeated in 2016-17, again beating Gillingham.

LAST SEASON

They started off impressively winning five of their opening nine matches including a 2-1 win away at Kidderminster Harriers. By the end of November, they had only lost two league games, against Alfreton Town and Worcester. This coincided with a fantastic FA Cup run in which they beat Gillingham 4-3 in a replay, before falling in the second round to Blackpool.

They continued to have success in the cup competitions, as impressive victories over Fylde, Stockport County and Wealdstone saw them reach the quarter-finals of the FA Trophy, where York City knocked them out at Bootham Crescent, 1-0.

For much of the season they had games in hand due to the success in cups, but their league form trailed away after the turn of the year. After back-to-back defeats against Salford and ourselves at Blackwell Meadows they did turn their fortune around. They went unbeaten in their last nine league games winning six of them. However, despite this late season run they just missed out on the playoffs. They finished the campaign in an impressive seventh place, just one point behind Chorley who clinched the last playoff place.

LAST MATCH

Boston United 2-3 Brackley

Brackley recorded a fifth win in six visits to Boston's York Street ground after another five-goal game.

Andy Brown found the bottom corner to give Saints a 10th minute lead which was doubled by Shane Byrne five minutes later as excellent build-up play on the left found Aaron Williams who threaded his pass across goal where Byrne made no mistake from close range, his third goal in four games.

Williams was on the score-sheet straight after the interval extending the visitors' lead, firing in from an angle after keeper George Willis could only parry Adam Walker's shot.

A dubious 53rd minute penalty however, perfectly despatched by Ashley Hemmings, spurred a revival by the home side and then a long throw caused a goalmouth scramble and substitute Jay Rollins fired in as the loose ball fell to him. The Boston manager Adam Murray resigned after the game.

MANAGER - KEVIN WILKIN

Former striker Wilkin played professionally for Northampton Town in the early 90's, also having spells with Cambridge United, Nuneaton, Rushden and Diamonds and

Grantham Town.

His managerial career started at Nuneaton Borough, where after re-ioining the club for his second spell this time as player/assistant manager he took over as permanent manager in 2006. After Borough was liquidated he was appointed manager of the new club Nuneaton Town. The club's first season saw Wilkin guide them to promotion through the play-offs after victory over Chasetown in the final. The season after his side clinched back-to-back promotions, again through the play-offs, this time beating Chippenham Town in the deciding game. However, perhaps his greatest accomplishment at Nuneaton was in 2012 when he guided them back into the Conference Premier after a nine year absence following another playoff triumph, thanks to a 1-0 win over Gainsborough Trinity.

He took over Conference Premier rivals Wrexham, but only lasted a year in the job. While they struggled in the league they reached the FA Trophy final. However, despite facing part time side North Ferriby United at Wembley they threw away a 2-0 lead to eventually lose on penalties, a result which led to Wilkin being sacked less than 24 hours later.

Wilkin took over at Brackley early in the 2015/16 season and guided them to safety in the National North on the final day of the season.

GARETH DEAN CAPTAIN



Defender Gareth Dean was signed from Solihull in the close season and is the current Brackley Town captain. At Solihull he was a member of the successful title winning side of last season. He signed for Solihull from Nuneaton, the club where he had spent the whole of his career up to this point, making his début for the club as an 18 year old in 2008. He made almost 300 appearances, earning three promotions in his first four seasons at Liberty Way, as the club climbed swiftly to the Conference Premier. He was included in the England "C" squad to play against Latvia Under-23s in September 2013. He was named in the Conference North team of the year for 2015/16 and teams up again with Kevin Wilkin who managed him at Nuneaton.

JAMES ARMSON

Armson was signed last summer, like



Gareth Dean, from Solihull. He was another player who gained promotion in 2016 after joining Solihull in the close season of 2015 from Nuneaton, James had progressed through Town's youth set-up and gained his England "C" cap in 2013 against Latvia. In his five year stint with Nuneaton James amassed over 100 games scoring 17 times. He brings valuable experience to the squad and is the personification of versatility having played for Nuneaton in every position on the pitch, including goalkeeper. However James favours an attacking midfield role and is a former Boro Player of the Year.

SHANE BYRNE

Shane Byrne signed from Nuneaton Town where he enjoyed a successful spell last season. Shane started his career at Dublin and was part of the youth team that reached the quarter finals of the FA Youth Cup in the 2010-11 season. On the international transfer deadline day in 2011 Byrne withdrew from the Republic of Ireland U19 squad in order to move on loan to Bury F.C.

Byrne made his professional début for Bury against Sheffield United on 3



September 2011. However, his time at Bury was curtailed after picking up an ankle injury at Colchester United on 10 December 2011. On 23 June 2015, it was confirmed that Byrne had joined Nuneaton Town, from where he joins the Saints. Byrne has represented the Republic of Ireland at U-17 on two occasions.

STEPHEN THOMPSON SCORES THE WINNER AGAINST BRACKLEY LAST SEASON

Darlington moved up to fifth place in the National League North table thanks to a Stephen Thompson winner against Brackley.

Considering that Quakers were missing their two regular centre halves, they never looked as if they would concede a goal, to record their second successive clean sheet and their fourth game in a row unbeaten.

Quakers nearly scored on 6 minutes, when Thompson crossed from the right, and Brackley defender Alex Gudger turned the ball towards the top corner of his own net, but keeper Laurie Walker clawed the ball away.

Quakers had the ball in the net on 21 minutes when David Syers headed in a Thompson cross, but the ref penalised Terry Galbraith for a foul on the keeper.

Quakers had a chance on 24 minutes when Cartman cut in from the left and struck a low drive that Walker saved, then

Another good move ended with Thompson forcing Walker into a good save, but Brackley had the chance of the half though when Jordan Hempenstall nodded the ball down for Matt Lowe, who was unmarked 12 yards out, but Darlington keeper Ed Wilczynski saved.

Quakers' early second half pressure was rewarded when they took the lead on 54 minutes. Beck and Syers both had attempts blocked in a crowded penalty area, but the ball ran on for Thompson to lash into the roof of the net for his sixth league goal of the season.

Quakers stayed firmly in control after that, and after a five minute stoppage because of a head injury to Brackley's Glenn Walker, they nearly got a second when Walker tipped Mark Beck's header from Galbraith's free kick over the bar. Defender Gary Brown says that he enjoyed his spell as caretaker manager alongside Phil Turnbull, but he isn't thinking of a career in management just yet.

he popular pair had a three game joint spell in charge, in which the team won once and drew once and provided some vital stability following the departure of Martin Gray.

"Now that I've been a caretaker manager, I appreciate much more of what goes into management," he said. "As a player, you turn up for training and play matches, you don't do much else.

"As a manager, there is so much more to do. Just in those couple of weeks, I spent a load of time on the phone to different people. I spoke to Peter Beardsley at Newcastle and Darren Edmondson at Carlisle about trying to get players on loan, and other managers and people about our opponents.

"I found myself watching highlights on websites, checking backgrounds and all sorts. I spent time writing up setpieces to use in training and pre match team talks

"Phil put on some great coaching sessions, and I think with him being a teacher, he was able to put his points and ideas across – I suppose it was second nature to him!

"Maybe I'll go into management when I finish playing. I'm 30 years old, and I still think I've got some playing years in me. But look at Tommy – he's 33 years old and has been a manager for four years already! I think if I do become a manager, then I would probably need someone with me to do the coaching."

The two Ws were appointed just hours before the Bradford game a fortnight ago, but Tommy wanted Cary to play a part still at Blyth last Saturday.

"Tommy asked me to go in the dugout at Blyth, and I was delighted. He said that he wanted an extra pair of eyes on the bench, and I was pleased to help out.

"When you're injured, the worst part about that is not feeling an integral part of the group. As much as the other lads talk to the injured lads to console them, you still feel separated from the group.

"So it was great to feel as if I was helping out in some ways, instead of sitting in the stand and getting frustrated.

"I'm really looking forward to playing under Tommy and Alan. They haven't put any pressure on the players. From the first time we met them before the Bradford game, they've encouraged the lads to go out and express themselves.

"They've told us not to worry about mistakes, as long as they're done honestly and we learn from them. All the lads have responded really well to them because they're so positive. They made the players feel at ease straight away, and as a player, that's how you want it."

Cary also thanked the fans for their help and support during his caretaker spell.

"The fans were fantastic towards us when Phil and I were in charge, but we didn't expect anything else. They're a great bunch, and they've always supported the two of us as players. We knew that we wouldn't get any negativity from them.

"Phil and I both thoroughly enjoyed our brief spells as caretaker managers, but I was pleased to hand the job over. There is so much more to consider.

"Now, I'm concentrating on getting myself fully fit again, and giving my all for Tommy and Alan on the pitch."

Tommy Wright takes charge of his first home game as Darlington manager, just over six years after playing his last game for us at Wembley. He spoke to Ray Simpson.

ommy seems to have packed a lot into his football career already, at the age of just 33.

A senior debut in the Premier League, England representative caps, a play off final appearance, a Wembley winner, promotion and relegation as a manager – and now three times a Ouaker!

He started his football career at Leicester City, working his way up through the club's youth sides and making his debut as a 17 year old against Leeds United in the Premier League in March 2002.

He scored his first senior goal for them in the following season when Leicester won at Gillingham in the Championship, and he made 13 appearances in the 2002-03 season as they bounced back into the Premier League. He also picked up caps for England Under 19s and England Under 20s.

Unfortunately, Tommy couldn't get into the Leicester team in the Premiership return season, so he was loaned out to Brentford and Blackpool before he signed for Barnsley for a £50,000 fee in 2006, helping the Tykes win the League One play offs at the Millennium Stadium.

After a loan period at Walsall, he signed for Quakers on the guarantee of regular first team football for the first time in in January 2007, and after scoring on his debut against Bury, he finished the season with four goals in total.

Tommy was distracted by a

few things at the time though, and one day was taken to one side by Martin Gray, who was assistant manager to Dave Penney at the time.

"I was all over the place at one point because so much was going on in my life. One day after training, Martin dragged me into the away changing room, and gave me what you would call a reality check. He told me to stop feeling sorry for myself! After that, I never looked back."

Tommy was just about unstoppable the following season, when he became a firm favourite with the fans. He scored 13 times in the league in the 2007-08 season, but he picked up a bad injury in the first leg of the play off semi final against Rochdale, and missed the second leg at Spotland.

"That was very frustrating, because I was in great goalscoring form. I was on crutches in the days before the second leg, and we had that many injuries in the squad that someone suggested that maybe I should have an injection in order to play, but I could hardly walk let alone run! There were nine of us injured in the back of the stand! If most of those players had stayed fit, then I'm sure we would have won promotion that season. It was sickening to lose in the play offs because obviously we wanted to play at Wembley."

However, Quakers were then forced to sell Tommy to ease their financial burden (to put it diplomatically) and he moved to Aberdeen the following summer for £100,000, but the move didn't work out, and he joined Grimsby on a free transfer in January 2010.

"There were a few clubs after me at the end of that season, including Aberdeen and Rochdale. I wasn't really bothered about moving, because I'd just bought a house and was quite settled. I'd also made some very good friends in the Darlington area, and I really loved it.

"But Dave Penney said that the club wasn't in a good place financially and even though we were both reluctant that I should go, I was sold to Aberdeen. Dave was under pressure from above to sell me and bring some money in."

He came back to Quakers in the summer of 2010 in a signing that was initiated by manager Simon Davey, and completed by chairman Raj Singh after Davey left. Under new manager Mark Cooper he played 29 times in total, including that famous game at Wembley when his header hit the bar and Chris Senior headed in the rebound. Ironically, that was his last touch of the ball as a Darlo player.

"Mark Cooper came in as manager, but I don't think he really took to me, and I was more out of the side than in it. I came on as sub in the first Trophy semi final against Gateshead when we came from behind to win 3-2, but I wasn't even in the squad

for the second leg at the International Stadium. I felt as if I was frozen out. there were a couple more players like me who stayed at home that day. I was well out of the picture, and was training with the youth team. I kept working hard by myself, and trying to convince myself that something was going to happen. I knew that I had to remain professional and not let the situation get to me.

"Then I was recalled to the team for a couple of league games because of injuries. One of the centre halves was injured, so Liam Hatch had to move from the forward line into defence. I scored against York City at home, and then against Rushden at home in the final league game. That was enough to keep me in the team for Wembley.

"I could have had a hat trick in the final, it was my boyhood dream to score at Wembley. But I wasn't sharp enough because I hadn't played enough games. I thought I was going to score with the diving header near the end, I really thought it was going in. I was really high in the air. level with the ball, but it went wide! It was almost the last touch of the ninety minutes, it would have been brilliant to score the winner then.

"I left that honour to Chris Senior. I did the hard work for him, heading the ball against the bar! I've watched the video on You Tube a lot, because it was the only time I've played at Wembley, and I was lucky enough to finish on the winning side. I've still got my medal and loads of photos."

Tommy was released by Cooper a few weeks after - he wasn't really surprised - and after playing for Kidderminster and Luton, went to Corby as a

player, and quickly, with some coaching badges behind him, became player-manager on the recommendation of a friend of the chairman. He won the Southern League title there, but they were relegated in their first season because they couldn't compete financially.

"I've got a title win with Corby behind me. People point to the fact that I've got a relegation as well, but the reason why I stuck it out at Corby was that the experience would stand me in good stead, and it would teach me a lot, and it did."

Nuneaton boss Kevin Wilson then approached Tommy to be player-coach, but within a few weeks he was made manager, and guided Nuneaton to an eight game winning run, that lifted them out of the relegation zone and into midtable safety.

One of those wins was against Quakers at Blackwell Meadows. "I felt very emotional last season when I returned as manager of Nuneaton and the fans gave me such a warm welcome back. I will always remember that applause, especially at the end of the game even though we had beaten Darlington."

When Tommy was offered the manager's job at Darlington last month. needless to say with all the positive experiences at Darlington previously, he jumped at the chance

"Without doubt I have affection for the football club. I have spoken about it for a long time. I always looked upon Darlington as my second home behind Leicester where I started my football career. The fanbase here is fantastic. and to manage a football club of this stature is an honour

and a privilege. I'll give it my everything.

"The ambition of this football club is to get back into the Football League. I left a full time group at Nuneaton and thoroughly enjoyed that, and it's made me a better coach and a better manager, but managing Darlington was an opportunity that I couldn't turn down."

Tommy approached Alan White to be his number two. and Alan also jumped at the chance to return. They have been with the players a fortnight now, and have seen them in match action twice as well as in four training sessions.

"Martin Grav has built an amazing set of lads, who are good and honest. This is what should be a play off squad. Alan and I will put our stamp on it, but I want to do one better than what was achieved last season, and that is to win the play offs.

"I think the players know what I want. As a player, I gave it everything and I want a high tempo attacking brand of football, and I'll enjoy working with them.

"I've watched a lot of the games that we've played this season - as well as being in the other technical area at Nuneaton a few weeks ago and I've got a fair idea of what people can do. I'm going to really get my teeth into it.

"I want to get this club back in the Football League. I won trophies as a player, and I want to take this club back to where it belongs. I can't think of anything I'd rather do.

"The support that I've had from supporters, players, everyone has been immense. If I can take the club forward, then I'll be delighted."

HOW THE OTHERS ARE DOING Chris Sykes

Salford City moved top of the division with a 1-0 win at Boston in midweek. Anthony Dudley's goal on the half hour mark made it three straight wins for the Ammies, moving them a point clear of Harrogate Town.

The Yorkshire side are seven games unbeaten in the league, although they did drop points in draws against Bradford PA and Leamington.

Those two sides have moved clear of the chasing pack, who are headed up by Blyth Spartans. 70 goals have been scored in league matches involving Spartans, an average of more than four a game.

Today's visitors Brackley, who are just a point behind Blyth, come into the game after backto-back victories. That ended a streak of six winless league games.

Last season's other promoted NPL side, Spennymoor, have, like Blyth, enjoyed a successful start to life at Step 2 level. Moors are a point behind Brackley after losing only one of their last six.

Chorley stayed sixth and inside the play-off places after a 1-1 draw with Tamworth on Tuesday.

That draw also kept the Lambs in the top seven, with Tamworth's 3-2 win at York on Saturday ending a run of three losses in a row.

Curzon Ashton slipped out of the play-off places after a surprise 1-0 defeat to struggling Gainsborough last weekend.

Since changing managers, York City have dropped to ninth in the league, with just one win in their last five.

10th-placed Kidderminster Harriers have quietly made ground on the top seven after losing only one of their last eight in the league.

AFC Telford, who travel to Hereford FC in the FA Cup today, are only two points off the play-off places.

Stockport County's play-off push has drifted somewhat in recent weeks, with four defeats in their last seven seeing the Hatters drop to 12th in the table. After going five games unbeaten, Alfreton had hoped to mount an assault on the top seven. But with three defeats in four matches, they've dropped back into the bottom half.

It's a similar story for Bradford PA, who have taken only two points from five matches to slip away from play-off contention.

Learnington are the division's most-improved side of recent weeks. Their goalless draw at Blackwell Meadows in September was the catalyst for a seven-game unbeaten run, which has taken the Midlands side five points clear of the relegation zone.

They're now above Southport on goal difference, with the Sandgrounders failing to win any of their last eight league games. Southport have won only once in the league since August, with that victory coming against Darlington in early September.

Just a point further back are Gainsborough Trinity, who created some breathing space between themselves and the drop zone with victory over Curzon Ashton last week. They host Southern Premier League side Slough in the FA Cup.

Nuneaton Town have lost both matches since Tommy Wright's departure, leaving them only a point and a place above the relegation places.

FC United, who are in the bottom three, are a point behind Nuneaton but with a game in hand. They've also lost one of their last four matches, and beat Nuneaton in the league last week.

Tuesday's defeat to Salford means Boston have taken only one point from seven league matches, leaving them three points from safety.

And North Ferriby continue to sit bottom of the division, and already look well adrift. They're nine points from safety, with just one win all competitions all season.

Exodus Geohaghon was sent off in Nuneaton's 3-1 home defeat by Stockport on 21st October.

The 1995/96 season promised to be an exciting time for Darlington fans. The club had just appointed David Hodgson and Jim Platt as their "dream team" management duo. One of their first jobs was to sell Adam Reed to Blackburn Rovers in order to balance the books, and to lift a transfer embargo, which the club found itself under. They then set about reshaping the squad for the coming campaign. One of their first signings was Gary Bannister, who joined the club as player coach. They also signed Phil Brumwell, Mark Barnard and Anthony Carss. Hodgson had previously worked as a football agent and he used his contacts to bring in trialists from far and wide The club kicked off the new season with two Portuguese players in the squad - Pedro Paulo and Rui Neves

The team didn't make the anticipated start to the season and only won one of their first ten games, which left them third from bottom in the table at the end of September. Hodgson even put the whole team up for sale after one particularly poor performance at home to Scarborough. October proved to be a good month though with five straight wins that moved the club up into the play-off positions. With their league campaign

now firmly back on track, the Ouakers could turn their attention to the FA Cup. When the draw for the first round was made Darlington had been paired with local rivals Hartlepool. The game would take place at Victoria Park on November 11th. The clubs had been drawn together six times in the FA Cup and at that moment they were honours even, with three wins each. The latest encounter would enable the winners to have bragging rights over their near neighbours.

Darlington's recent good form had lifted them to 7th place in the table with 25 points from their 16 games. Hartlepool weren't having such a good time and sat in 19th place with 18 points, but had a good home record, being unbeaten in eight home games, winning three and drawing five, so a tight, hard fought game was in prospect. The Quakers were forced into making two changes from their team for the match. Left back Mark Barnard was cup tied, having already played in an early qualifying round for Worksop Town. His place went to Phil Brumwell. Striker Glenn Naylor had spent a month on loan with the club from York City. He had returned to York and would be replaced in the team by Steve Gaughan.

Simon Weatherill remembers a classic away win at Hartlepool on 11th November 1995 in this week's Memory Match.

> On a wet and windy, miserable afternoon, a crowd of 3834 were at Victoria Park for the FA Cup showdown. They saw the home side make the better start, and have the Quakers on the back foot early on. Ex Darlington player Mick Tait should have opened the scoring in the 8th minute when Mike Pollitt failed to collect a cross, and Tait chipped wide of the empty net from 20 yards out. A minute later Stephen Halliday burst between two defenders but fired his shot straight at Pollitt. Pools got the lead that their early play deserved in the 13th minute A neat flicked ball forward by Halliday found Scott Sloan on the edge of the box and he superbly volleyed first time into the top right hand corner. They very nearly increased their lead two minutes later when a good run by Halliday finished with a thumping drive just wide of the post. Darlington began to find their feet on the difficult surface and equalised on 25 minutes. Steve Gaughan beat the offside trap and raced clear down the right before squaring the ball to the far post where Phil Brumwell slid in and fired the ball home. The Ouakers were well on top now and took the lead with an almost carbon copy goal in the 37th minute. This time it was Paul



Olsson who made progress down the right, hurdling a challenge from full back lan McGuckin and crossing to the far post where Gaughan forced the ball home with a close range header, to make the half time score, Hartlepool 1 Darlington 2.

Darlington began the second half as they had finished the first - in total control. They increased their lead in the 59th minute when Gaughan put Robbie Painter through on goal, but Pools keeper Brian Horne made a good save at the striker's feet. He couldn't hold the ball though. which ran loose back to Gaughan, who squared the rebound to Gary Bannister, and he lashed the ball into the roof of the net from near the penalty spot. They kept pressing forward and made the game safe five minutes later when Mattie Appleby played a great ball down the right to Painter, who this time made no mistake, cutting

inside and drilling home from the corner of the box.

At 4-1 in front the Quakers eased off and allowed Pools back into the game. Halliday scored a well taken goal on 75 minutes, although he looked suspiciously offside when he cut in from the left and fired home off the body of Pollitt. In a spirited finish Pools went close again when Pollitt saved superbly from Sloan and in the ensuing goalmouth scramble Simon Shaw seemed to handle the ball but somehow escaped conceding a penalty. The Ouakers had started slowly and finished sloppily but in between they had been devastating and fully deserved their 4-2 win

The game proved to be Mike Pollitt's last in a Darlington shirt. Immediately after the game he was sold to Notts County, which lead shortly afterwards to the resignation of David Hodgson, who claimed the transfer was completed behind his back, and he left the club, saying that he was sick of the internal politics and that he'd been misled about the club's financial position.

Hartlepool produced a 32 page programme for the 95/96 season, priced at £1.30. The programme included two pages of pen pics of Quakers players, a page of "stats and facts" of the season so far, and ten "interesting facts" about the two clubs and their rivalry.



Darlington Youth



Three lads from our youth set up recently spent a week training at FC Porto.

Graeme Lumley, the father of Fynn Lumley, travelled with the party, and wrote:

Darlington FC players Fynn Lumley (goalkeeper ul3), Milo Harris (forward ul3) and Kieran Dixon (midfielder ul4) all spent the half term week training at the Youth Academy of FC Porto, in Portugal.

The first two days' training were spent at Vitalis Park, in the heart of the city of Porto. Once the original home stadium, the location is now the Youth Academy base and enjoys two 3G pitches, one partially covered to provide shade. Each day the boys were given lunch in the Academy canteen before being issued with fresh FC Porto training kit and heading out onto the pitches.

For the first two days Fynn was fortunate enough to be keeper training on his own, with three Academy keeper coaches for company. Interestingly they spent much of the time working with ball into his feet, and when I spoke with Thiago (one of the keeper coaches) he said it was most important that Fynn could play football and not just make saves. Several drills were focussed around passing fast balls into him and closing him down quickly so that he had to control, open out and pass to the opposite side under pressure. They also spent some time showing him how to "chop" his kicks from his hands so that the ball travelled flatter and further (rather than the traditional up and under keeper kicks).

The outfield players also had 4 coaches drilling them in ul4 and ul6 groups - the focus being very much on ball possession, touch, and passing. The speed and intensity of the drills,

particularly in the 27degree heat was high. Again, they were very keen to instil a real sense of pace and quality to the boys passing - giving the ball away cheaply, or making a poor quality pass was really discouraged, but above all the coaches were incredibly supportive and positive in their coaching style.

We then spent 2 days training at FC Fao, which is a local 3rd division side who act as a feeder academy for FC Porto. The same coaches joined us there and again the training, preparation and professionalism was first class, with top quality 3G semi-grass surfaces, lunches, and kit all laid on. We also played 2 competitive matches at FC Fao, the first night game being Polam ul3's against Dragon Force (FC Porto's academy) ul2's and lost a close fought 2-1. This was followed by an even later 20:30 KO ul6 game, where FC Fao Academy ran out 6-0 winners.

During the week we were invited as guests to an FC Porto home match, at Estadio do Dragao, where they drew 0-0 with local rivals and 2nd tier leaders Leixoes in the Taca da Liga (League Cup).

Finally, on our last day we returned to Estadio do Dragao for lunch with the coaching staff in one of the executive boxes, followed by medal presentations to all the boys, a back stage tour of the stadium and visit to the FC Porto museum, quite possibly the best museum I've ever been to... An obligatory trip to the club shop saw all the lads shell out for FC Porto tops and we headed back to England. I think everyone took something from the week and the FC Porto coaches were really keen to understand how our coaching in the UK differed from theirs. I think we might have a Darlington 'FC Porto' supporters club in the making!!

Six year old Tobias Slade, who has been popping the goals in for the Under 7s, recently had a trial at Newcastle United, and played in a tournament for them.





REMINDER OF DARLINGTON FOOTBALL CLUB'S

GROUND REGULATIONS

n home games last season, there were incidents involving a flare, some coin throwing and fans encroaching on to the field of play. Accordingly, we have been requested to remind fans about our ground regulations.

These regrettable incidents are contrary to our ground regulations, as published on our official website on 12th October last year, and again last week.

The pertinent regulations are as follows:

"The following articles must not be brought within the Ground - knives, fireworks or any other pyrotechnics, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, glass bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles, any articles that are prohibited by the Rules and Regulations, and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to (or ejected from) the Ground."

And

"Under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended) the following are offences for which a person can be arrested by a police officer and conviction could result in a Banning Order being made under the Football Spectators Act 1989 (as amended): The list is non-exhaustive.

"The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse;

"The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse."

We should be very clear. Those responsible for such incidents simply do not care about our club. our reputation or the safety of our fans and we do not want them at our matches. The club will work with the stewards and police to ensure that these matters are addressed and the individuals will be banned from future matches.

Ensuring the safety of our supporters and staff is always of paramount importance to Darlington FC 1883. If such behaviour was to continue, the reality is it would only be a matter of time before serious injury is caused and the club in turn would be punished by the league and/or the FA. We will not allow safety to be compromised of the well-behaved and sensible majority by the actions of a tiny minority.



We would also like to draw attention to the possession

As a member Club participating in The National League we have been directed to take the strongest action available against anyone found in possession of a Flare, Smoke Bomb or any other such pyrotechnic article(s).

Spectators are warned that we and The National League apply a zero tolerance approach to anyone attempting to bring such article(s) into our Ground/ Stadium.

Due to their chemical makeup, a Flare, Smoke Bomb and all such pyrotechnic article(s) can be highly toxic for some people. This can lead to serious health consequences for those with pre-existing medical conditions and may in certain circumstances cause lifethreatening injury or concern.

In order to protect you, the spectator, we reserve the right to search your person and/or effects and we further reserve the right to pursue legal action, civil or criminal, against any person who contravenes current legislation or our Ground/ Stadium regulations.

To further safeguard all who attend any event at this Ground/ Stadium, we welcome the receipt of any information which will assist us to deter. apprehend/detain and where appropriate prosecute, anyone in possession of: or found discharging or being a party to the discharge of, such an article(s).

October 30th 1965

Division Four

Darlington 4 Aldershot 3, attendance 5651

We were building up momentum for a promotion push ahead of this game, having won three and drawn one of our previous four games.

We'd just signed Bobby Cummings from Newcastle with the money from the sale of Tommy Lawton to Swindon, and Cummings had already scored five times before this game.

He wasn't to let the crowd down, scoring again in this win, with Eddie Johnstone (2) and Alan Sproates also on target as Aldershot pushed us all the way.

Four days later, we went to First Division Ipswich and gave them a run for their money before losing 2-0 in the Football League Cup.

November 3rd 1987

Division Four

Darlington 1 Crewe Alexandra 0, attendance 1729

We'd been relegated from the old Third Division the season before, and were consolidating in Division Four. In our previous home game, we'd drawn 2-2 with Wolves, but then lost the next match at Colchester.

Gary Worthington was our matchwinner to give us the three points, and keep us on course for a midtable finish.

November 2nd 1993

Division Three

Darlington 7 Colchester United 3, attendance 1844

This was one of the most remarkable nights in Quakers' history. After opening the season without a win in 13 league games which saw the resignation of manager Billy McEwan, we thumped Colchester at Feethams. We'd only scored seven league goals all season until this game!

It's fair to say that nobody could believe what they saw, as Quakers ran rampant, although we were a little shaky at the other end, hence prompting new manager Alan Murray to say; "I only felt comfortable when we were four goals ahead."

Lee Ellison (2), Robbie Painter (2), Gary Chapman (2) and Gary Himsworth were the scorers, the pick of the goals being a diving header by Chapman near the end.
