BRACKLEY TOWN - THEIR SEASON SO FAR

Brackley come to Blackwell Meadows needing a win to keep alive their faint play-off hopes. After surviving relegation on the final day last season they have had a brilliant season in comparison this time around.

They started off impressively winning five of their opening nine matches including a 2-1 win away at Kidderminster Harriers. By the end of November they had only lost two league games, against Alfreton Town and Worcester. This coincided with a fantastic FA Cup run in which they beat Gillingham 4-3 in a replay, before falling in the second round to Blackpool.

They continued to have success in the cup competitions, as impressive victories over Fylde. Stockport County and Wealdstone saw them reach the guarter-finals of the FA Trophy, where York City knocked them out at Bootham Crescent, 1-0.

For much of the season they have had games in hand due to the success in cups, but their league form has trailed away since the turn of the year. They have lost five times in the league in 2017, however, these have come against other teams in the promotion mix. Chorley, Stockport County, Tamworth, Fylde and most recently Salford City.

They are five points behind ourselves with a game in hand, six points behind Halifax Town in the final play-off place.

Brackley's play-off hopes suffered a setback at St James Park on Saturday, as promotion chasing Salford City were able to return home with all three points.

Their biggest home league crowd of the season, 738, saw a tight first-half that was full of incident. Both sides had chances to take the lead. Josh Hine was through on goal for Salford with Laurie Walker saving well. At the other end Jordan Hempenstall saw his effort tipped over. while Adam Walker fired a shot over the top for Brackley who shaded the half.

Early in the second period Michael Nottingham headed a corner kick onto the bar and reacted quickly to stab home the loose ball in what turned out to be the crucial moment in the game. Hempenstall's flick set David Moyo away through the middle earning only a corner, but that was the nearest Brackley came to drawing level.

MANAGER – KEVIN WILKIN



Former striker Wilkin played professionally for Northampton Town in the early 90s, also having spells with Cambridge United, Nuneaton, Rushden and

Diamonds and Grantham Town.

His managerial career started at Nuneaton Borough, where after re-joining the club for his second spell this time as player/assistant manager he took over as permanent manager in 2006. After Borough was liquidated he was appointed manager of the new club Nuneaton Town. The club's first season saw Wilkin guide them to promotion through the play-offs after victory over Chasetown in the final. The season after, his side clinched back-to-back promotions, again through the play-offs, this time beating Chippenham Town in the deciding game. However, perhaps his greatest accomplishment at Nuneaton was in 2012 when he guided them back into the Conference Premier after a nine year absence following another play-off triumph, thanks to a 1-0 win over Gainsborough Trinity.

He took over Conference Premier rivals Wrexham, but only lasted a year in the job. Even though they finished midtable in the league they reached the FA Trophy final. However, despite facing part time side North Ferriby United at Wembley they threw away a 2-0 lead to eventually lose on penalties, a result which led to Wilkin being sacked less than 24 hours later. Wilkin took over at Brackley early in the 2015/16 season and guided them to safety in the National North on the final day of the season.

GARETH DEAN CAPTAIN DEFENDER



Defender Gareth Dean was signed from Solihull in the close season and is the current Brackley Town captain. At Solihull he was a member of the successful title winning side

of last season. He signed for Solihull from Nuneaton, the club where he had spent the whole of his career up to this point, making his début for the club as an 18 year old in 2008. He made almost 300 appearances, earning three promotions in his first four seasons at Liberty Way, as the club climbed swiftly to the Conference Premier. A former Player of the Year, Gareth was captain of Nuneaton. He was included in the England "C" squad to play against Latvia Under-23s in September 2013. He was named in the Conference North team of the year for 2015/16 and teams up again with Kevin Wilkin who managed him at Nuneaton.

JAMES ARMSON - TOP SCORER -MIDFIELDER

Armson was signed last summer, like Gareth Dean, from Solihull. He was another player who gained promotion last season after joining Solihull in the close season 2015 from Nuneaton, James had progressed through Town's youth set-up and gained his England "C" cap in 2013 against Latvia. In his five year stint with Nuneaton James amassed over 100 games scoring 17 times. He brings valuable experience to the squad. He is the personification of versatility having played for Nuneaton in every position on the pitch, including goalkeeper. However, James favours an attacking midfield role and is a



former Boro Player of the Year.

SHANE BYRNE-MIDFIELDER

Shane Byrne signed from Nuneaton Town where he enjoyed a successful spell last season. Shane started his career at Dublin and was part of the youth team that reached the quarter finals of the Irish FA Youth Cup in the 2010–11 season. On the international transfer deadline day in 2011 Byrne withdrew from the Republic of Ireland U19 squad in order to move on loan to Bury F.C.

Byrne made his professional début for Bury against Sheffield United on 3 September 2011. However, his time at Bury was curtailed after picking up an ankle injury at Colchester United on 10 December 2011. On 23 June 2015, it was confirmed that Byrne had joined Nuneaton Town, from where he joins the Saints. Byrne has represented the Republic of Ireland at U-17 level on two occasions.

BRACKLEY TOWN - KEY MOMENTS IN THEIR HISTORY

- Founded in 1890 and became prominent side in the local Northamptonshire area
- Moved to current St James Park ground in 1974
- In the early 90s the club's survival was in danger and in 1992/93 finished with the worst playing record of any senior side in the country
- Brackley were forced into voluntary liquidation in February 1999
- The 2003/04 season saw them win the Hellenic League to gain promotion back to the Southern League
- Three seasons later they gained promotion to the Southern Premier division
- They reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in 2008/09
- Arguably the club's greatest moment came at the end of the 2011/12 season when they lifted the Southern League Premier Division title to gain a place in the National North
- In 2013/14 they beat Gillingham live on TV in the FA Cup first round, a feat which they repeated this season, again beating Gillingham

Darlington extended their unbeaten start away from home to seven matches, but they had to be satisfied with just a point at Brackley.

Quakers played some great flowing football, but they couldn't press home their advantage when they took the lead for the second time.

Quakers went close on 13 minutes, when Terry Galbraith curled a free kick over from the left into the middle, where Gary Brown put a looping header just over the top.

Brackley hit the woodwork on 15 minutes when Glenn Walker whipped a free kick in from the right, and Jordan Watson's attempted clearing header went against his own crossbar and out for a corner.

Quakers took the lead on 25 minutes with a superb goal. Terry Galbraith came back on the field after lengthy treatment, won the ball on the halfway line, found Mark Beck who then laid the ball off for Stephen Thompson to hit a blistering right foot shot from 25 yards that flew into the top right corner.

It was nearly 2-0 four minutes later when Josh Falkingham won possession and set up Thompson again, but this time he mishit his right foot shot well wide. STEPHEN THOMPSON SCORING AT BRACKLEY

But Brackley levelled just on half time, when Glenn Walker curled a corner into the six yard box for Gareth Dean to stab in with Paul Woolston stranded.

Quakers always looked dangerous with wide men Thompson and Josh Gillies, and they went 2-1 up on 59 minutes when Gillies made another good run and was tripped just outside the box, and he curled the resultant free kick delightfully over the five man wall and into the net.

It was nearly 3-1 when Gillies made another great run from the left and hit a powerful right foot shot just over the angle. Brackley levelled on 74 minutes when James Armson crossed from the left for Shane Byrne to beat Paul Woolston with a looping header that dropped into the corner.

There were a mammoth 15 former Darlington players involved when Spennymoor Town beat Blyth Spartans 2-1 in their crunch clash on February 28.

JAMIE CHANDLER got the winning goal at the Brewery Field in a match which ended Spartans' 12-match winning run and lifted Moors to fourth in the Northern Premier League.

As well as Chandler, also in the Moors starting XI were DAN LOWSON, CHRIS MASON, JOE TAIT, ROB RAMSHAW and NATHAN FISHER. DAVID DOWSON and ADAM MITCHELL came off the bench, as did TOM WHITE, who was on trial with Darlington in the summer of 2015. GRAEME ARMSTRONG was an unused sub.

In the Blyth starting XI was goalkeeper **PAUL WOOLSTON**,

who was on loan to Quakers earlier this season from Newcastle, and JORDAN WATSON was with Darlington for the first half this season. Right-back ANDREW CARTWRIGHT, a first-half substitute, was on loan to Darlington from Sunderland in 2015.

Meanwhile, ALAN WHITE is among the Spennymoor coaching staff, while Blyth are managed by ALUN ARMSTRONG.

There were two former Darlington goalkeepers on the pitch when Shildon beat Dunston UTS 4-1 at Dean Street on March 4.

Shildon's No. 1 is **NICK LIVERSEDGE**, while at the other end of the pitch was **JACK NORTON**, who was Quakers' keeper during the first few months of our Northern League season in



There were five other former Quakers in the Shildon squad - MARC ELLISON, DANIEL GROVES, ANTHONY BELL, LEWIS WING, AMAR PUREWAL - while CARL JONES played for Dunston. Jones played a League Cup game for Quakers against Spennymoor Town in 2012.

MARK BOWER won the Vanarama National League North's manager of the month award for February, as his team, Bradford Park Avenue, won all three of their league games to lift themselves out of the bottom three. Of his 20 games in charge since he joined the club, he won nine and drew one. He was previously manager of Guiseley in the National League.

NEIL ASPIN won the Vanarama National League's manager of the month award for February. Craig Stoddart and Ray Simpson have been keeping an eye on the activities of former Darlo players.



The former Darlington centre half had a great month, as Gateshead won all four of their matches to push them into play off contention. Typically though, he wasn't getting carried away, and said; "I'm really pleased because it means that the team is doing well and we're very hopeful that we can continue. We're not getting carried away. I've known a good friend of mine in football win manager of the month one month and then be sacked at the end of the next month, so you don't take anything for granted."

LEE GASKELL is back at Ramsbottom United, the club from which he joined Quakers in 2015, and he has wasted no time in getting on the scoresheet at the Evo-Stik First Division North club.

He scored the only goal of the game in his first match back

at the club, against Tadcaster Albion, and a week later scored twice in a 2-2 draw at Brighouse Town.

He scored 113 goals in 224 appearances for Ramsbottom in two spells , and Rams boss Mark Fell said Gaskell will have a big role to play for the remainder of the season: "At this level he's as good as anyone out there and we're really pleased to add him to our squad. He's a winner and a goalscorer and will complement our existing forwards. We still have a good opportunity to gate crash the play-offs with a dozen big games ahead of us, so when opportunities arise to sign a player of Lee's quality, and vou have the ambition we have at the club. then it's a nobrainer".

In between those matches, however, Ramsbottom were stuffed 7-0 by Farsley Celtic for whom two ex-Quakers scored hat-tricks: LEWIS NIGHTINGALE and JAMES WALSHAW.

Nightingale followed that treble by scoring a last-minute winner on March 11 in a 2-1 win over Ossett Albion.

Nightingale joined Darlington last summer from Farsley, but after a solitary appearance as a substitute the winger



soon returned to the West Yorkshire club.

Two former Darlington players are in the running for the EvoStik NPL supporters player of the year award.

DALE HOPSON, who was one of the few successes in the 2011-12 season, left Darlington for Whitby two seasons ago and has been nominated by their supporters.

JAMES WALSHAW was also with Quakers that season after arriving from Guiseley,

and he has been nominated by the supporters of his current club, Farsley.

They are up against Elliott Rokka of Radcliffe Borough, Anthony Malbon of Kidsgrove and Dan Maguire of Blyth.

Newton Aycliffe in their 3-0 away win at West Auckland CRAIG GOTT scored for Marske in their 4-3 home defeat by Penrith JAMIE CHANDLER scored the winner for Spennymoor at Halesowen after JOE TAIT had earlier equalised ... Where are they now? ALAN ROBERTS



Alan Roberts spent three years at Darlington and played a major part in keeping Quakers in the old Third Division at the time. He spoke to Ray Simpson.



20 year old winger Alan was signed by Darlington manager Cyril Knowles from Middlesbrough in July 1985. the summer after Quakers had won promotion to the old Third Division - a major achievement for Quakers then considering that a thin squad was stretched to the limit on several occasions. Many would argue that it was an

even bigger achievement that in season 1985-86 in the company of clubs such as Derby County, Wolves, Bristol City and Bolton Wanderers, Quakers recovered from being bottom in November, to finish midtable in season 1985-86.

"Willie Maddren was manager of Middlesbrough, and I wasn't getting any games under him,"

he said. "I was a winger, but just like all wingers, if the team was playing badly, then the winger would be the first one to be dropped. That was a fact of football life for a winger because it's a specialised role. If I was a centre midfielder, then maybe I wouldn't have been dropped as much!

"I knew Cyril from his days at

Middlesbrough when he was the reserve team coach there, and he came in for me when I was available for transfer at Boro, and persuaded me to sign for Darlington.


"He'd done really well at Darlington, considering that he didn't have the biggest squad to choose from. I knew a couple of the Darlington lads as well, such as Paul Ward, who was with me at Boro, and Phil Lloyd. There were a lot of lads who had been at bigger clubs, and hadn't quite made it. Steven Bell, for example, had been at Wolves.

"In my first pre-season, we had a few injury problems as we were building up to the start of the season, and it was debatable whether we would get a team out for the first game! The squad was that thin, even counting some of the youngsters that Cyril put in the squad.

"But despite the lack of bodies, we managed to stay up in my first season. I can't remember many games – it's that long ago! – but in my third season when we were back in the Fourth Division I do remember winning 5-2 at Hartlepool. I started the game on the right wing, and Steven Bell started on the left, but in the second half we swapped wings and tore them apart.

"I used to love playing at Feethams though, it had its own special character and charm, and there was a great atmosphere,"

As many players around that time have revealed in memories since, Cyril had a unique management style (murderball anyone?) which didn't go down well with everyone, but Alan got on well with the former Tottenham defender.




"I knew Cyril well from his time at Middlesbrough. He ruled with an iron fist, but I respected him. I think because I was brought up in the east end of Newcastle, I was used to industrial language, and people saying it as it is. So I knew what to expect when I joined him at Darlington.

"Cyril's attitude was that players should be as competitive in training as they are in matches, so he used to fly into tackles in training! "On my first day at Middlesbrough as a 16 year old, he tried to wipe me out in a training session but I got up and went through him in the next tackle, and I think after that we respected each other to a certain extent.

"Cyril ruled through fear sometimes, but I didn't dislike it. That was football in those days."

Alan moved house from Newton Aycliffe to Darlington when he transferred to Feethams. "I was "For Fans, For Football, For Ever"

one of only a few lads who lived in the town. I didn't mind, I quite liked the town and the fans, and I've still got affection for it now." He now lives in Willington near Bishop Auckland.

After scoring 19 goals in 133 matches over three seasons, Alan moved from Quakers to Sheffield United at the end of the 1987-88 season when we were back in the old Fourth Division, and he won promotion with United from the Third Division to the Second, then he moved on to Lincoln City, where he suffered a bad knee injury.

"I had only played eight or nine games for them, and I picked up a bad knee ligament injury. Unfortunately, I never really recovered, even though Lincoln were very good and arranged plenty of physiotherapy. The surgeon opened up my knee and actually told me that I would struggle to reach a good level of fitness in order to play again. I actually didn't kick a ball again for eight years when my eldest son asked me to play for his five-aside team."

Alan's son Jordan, is now making a name for himself in the USA playing for Reno 1868, a team in the state of Nevada.

"He studied a scholarship at Quincy University, and signed for St Louis FC, which was in the league below Major League Soccer. He had two years there as a pro, and he's just been



transferred to Reno. He was at Newcastle Academy for five years before being released, and then he went over to the States."

Alan, who is a financial advisor, has been to see Quakers play. "I've been to a couple of games, I went to the Darlington v Spennymoor play off semi final and it was great to see Darlo win.

"It was sad to see the club relegated to the Northern League. It's hard to comprehend that when I was in my second season at Darlington, Middlesbrough were in the same division – look at the gap now. Hopefully, the club will keep rising and get back into the Football League. At least it's back in the town now and the right people are in charge."

"I used to love playing at Feethaws though, it had its own special character and charw, and there was a great atwosphere,"



A run of five games unbeaten has seen AFC Fylde tighten their grip on the title race, as the season enters its final few games. The Coasters are eleven points clear of their nearest rivals.

Three teams; Salford, Kidderminster and Chorley, head the chasing pack, all level on 62 points.

Salford go into today's games in second place on goal difference, although their momentum has been slowed in recent weeks by defeats against Tamworth and Gloucester.

Kidderminster are third, but with a game in hand on the Ammies. Their 3-0 win over Alfreton last week saw them put a stop to a poor run of form, which had seen them lose three games in four.

After a slip of form in January and early February, Chorley have got their season back on track, after losing just one of their last eight.

Over the last 10 games, FC Halifax are the most inform side in the division, with just one defeat and seven victories in that spell. The Shaymen occupy the final play-off spot, four points behind Chorley.

They're ahead of Stockport on goal difference, with the Hatters having lost only one of their last 15 league games, a run stretching back to mid-November. The Hatters, who have played a game more than Halifax, are a point ahead of Darlington.

Eighth placed Tamworth have dropped off the pace following indifferent results since the turn of the year. They've lost three of their last four, but did beat Salford a fortnight ago, to sit five points behind the play-offs.

Today's visitors Brackley are a point further back, with a game in hand. Their defeat to Salford last weekend ended a run of four games without defeat

Harrogate Town have fought their way back into play-off contention after losing just once in the league in 2017. They're unbeaten in six and lie seven points behind the play-offs.

And Gloucester City retain faint hopes of making the top five, despite having won only one of their last five matches, to sit eight points off fifth -placed Halifax.

> Twelfth placed FC United of Manchester have consolidated in mid-table after winning their last three games, having failed to win any of the seven games before that.

Two points further back are Curzon Ashton, who saw a three-game unbeaten run ended by Stockport last weekend.

After picking up seven points from their last three games, Nuneaton seem to have extinguished any fears of relegation, which had been brought on by taking just one point from their previous five matches.

Boston United are six points above the drop zone, and have taken only four points from their last six games.

16th-placed AFC Telford had looked to be edging to safety after a run of one defeat in four. But back-to-back losses to Brackley and Chorley mean they're just four points above relegation.

They're above Alfreton on goal difference, who also have a game in hand. Alfreton have lost three of their previous four games.

Back-to-back defeats have stunted Bradford PA's strong recent form. They sit one point and two places above the drop zone.

Consecutive draws against Darlington and Nuneaton have lifted Worcester out of the relegation zone on goal difference. The Blues though haven't won in the league since November, a run of 15 matches.

Replacing them in the drop zone are Gainsborough Trinity, who've taken just one point from their last six games.

After two wins in their last four, Altrincham have moved off the bottom of the table, but remain 14 points from safety with nine games left.

Stalybridge dropped to the foot of the division after losing to Darlington last weekend. They're 15 points adrift, but could have moved back above Altrincham if they avoided defeat against Bradford PA on Tuesday.





In the latest in our Memory Match series, Simon Weatherill looks at the home game against Wimbledon on 17th March 1981.

The 1980/81 season kicked off with Billy Elliott. in his second year at the helm, promising to do things differently. The club had finished the previous season in the bottom four re-election places and Elliott reacted by releasing eleven players and vowing that from now on Darlington would rely on a much smaller, vounger plaving staff.

Memory Match

He named Donald Ball as club captain who at the age of 18 became the youngest captain in the Football League. Only four new signings were made before the season kicked off. Goalkeeper Pat Cuff was signed from Millwall, full back Alan Kamara from York City, central defender Peter Skipper from Hull City and midfielder David Speedie was brought in from Barnsley. The club kicked off the new campaign with one of the youngest sides in the club's history. A month into the new season Elliott added left back Harry Wilson from Preston. but that still only brought his first team squad up to fourteen players. Youngsters such as Kevin Barry, Kevin Glendinning and Barry Stell would back them up as and when required. His trimmed down squad was a success and the club had their most successful season for more than a decade. They spent virtually all season just out of the promotion race, comfortably in the top half of the table, but

never really threatening the top four.


By the time Wimbledon visited Feethams on Tuesday March 17th, the Quakers were sat in 11th place in Division 4 with 37 points from 36 games. Their visitors were four points better off in sixth place and with games in hand on all the teams above them they were looking to mount a strong challenge for a promotion place. They were on a twelve match unbeaten run and named the same team for the ninth game in a row. Elliott had injury worries with four players carrying knocks after the long trip to Bournemouth (a 3-3 draw) on the previous Saturday. Kevan Smith, John Stalker, Roger Wicks and Ian Hamilton were all under treatment and had to pass fitness tests to play. The original game against Wimbledon had been scheduled for January 17th but had been postponed due to heavy snow.

A disappointing crowd of only 2093 turned out for the rearranged game. They saw the Quakers make a strong start and take the lead as early as the third minute, when David Speedie ran on to John Stalker's flick on and tucked the ball neatly under visiting keeper Dave Beasant. The game continued at breakneck speed with some fine football played by both sides. Prompted by the industrious Steve

Galliers in midfield. Wimbledon carved out and missed two good chances before eventually scoring a deserved equaliser in the 30th minute through centre half Mick Smith, who took advantage of some static home defending to fire home.

They were level for only five minutes though before lan Hamilton restored Darlington's lead. He latched onto an Alan Walsh chipped pass over the defence and rounded the giant Beasant before slotting home to make the half time score 2-1. The hard fought contest had always been in danger of boiling over. Smith and Stalker were both booked after a touchline tangle, and Tommy Cunningham followed them into the referee's notebook before half time

After the break Alan Kamara twice went close to increasing the home sides lead, then Roger Wicks produced a superb turn and volley that was well saved by Beasant. Referee Ken Walmsley had to pull players apart in a centre circle free for all, then he booked Galliers and Harry Charlton, as they squared up to each other after a tackle, as both sides refused to take a step backwards with the game in the balance. The deciding moment of the evening came in the 75th minute. A long cross beyond the far post was headed back by Peter Skipper. The ball hit the post



and dropped to Stalker whose shot was blocked, but fell to Charlton, who forced the ball into the net from close range to make the score 3-1. Wimbledon were incensed, claiming that the ball had gone out of play before Skipper headed it back. Cunningham sprinted 50 yards to argue with the linesman and received his second booking. Galliers also protested too strongly as tempers flared and he too received his marching orders. Darlington drove home their two man advantage five minutes later when Alan Walsh fired home his 20th goal of the season after being set up by Charlton to make the final score 4-1 to the Quakers.

The fun and games didn't end there though as the players clashed after the final whistle. Wimbledon's Wally Downes had to be restrained by team mates as he squared up to lan Hamilton and Walmsley booked three more players plus visiting assistant manager Alan Gillette after a mass confrontation in the tunnel

Wimbledon put their heaviest defeat of the season behind them and went on another good run, only losing two of their last ten games, to finish in fourth place and secure promotion. It was the beginning of an incredibly successful spell for the club under their manager Dave Bassett, who led them on a rise right through the divisions. Six years later they would finish 6th in the top flight and the following year, 1988, 1 and won the FA Cup. The Quakers eventually finished the season in a creditable 8th place with 49 points, 6 points behind fourth place. The much improved season was due in no small part to the potent strike force of Stalker and Walsh. who

It was a double first for Quakers when we beat Altrincham in our first night match at Blackwell Meadows.

You always like to mark a first occasion in the right manner, and Josh Falkingham and Terry Galbraith made it a night to remember.

Quakers went close after 2 minutes when Falkingham crossed low from the left, and Altrincham defender John Cyrus sliced a clearance over his own crossbar. Quakers scored from the corner that followed. David Ferguson curled the corner into the box where David Syers helped the ball on for Mark Beck to prod home at the far post.

Quakers dominated play, but Altrincham nearly scored with their first shot at goal on 17 minutes, when Elliot Newby found space and 25 yards out and aimed for the bottom corner, but Ed Wilczynski got down well low to his left and pushed the shot away.

Quakers went 2-0 up on 28 minutes when Beck helped on a long clearance for midfielder Josh Falkingham to race through and beat Tim Deasy with a low left foot shot for his first Quakers goal.

But Altrincham pulled a goal back on 33 minutes when Wilczynski could only parry a left foot shot by James Lawrie, and Elliot Newby put the ball into the net.

Quakers hit the bar just on half time, when Beck headed Ferguson's corner down for Gary Brown to head against the bar.

The game had a few chances after that until the 78th minute, when Ferguson was tripped by Sam Heathcote as he ran into the box and the referee pointed to the spot for Terry Galbraith to send the keeper the wrong way - the first successful Darlo penalty at Blackwell Meadows and Tez's ninth of the season!







After retiring from the Post office in Middleton St George I help out one day a week in Quaker Retail. On match days, I help sell 50/50 tickets outside the around."



REMINDER OF DARLINGTON FOOTBALL **CLUB'S GROUND** REGULATIONS

In home games last season, there were incidents involving a flare, some coin throwing and fans encroaching on to the field of play. Accordingly, we have been requested to remind fans about our ground regulations.

These regrettable incidents are contrary to our ground regulations, as published on our official website on 12th October last year, and again last week.

The pertinent regulations are as follows:

"The following articles must not be brought within the Ground - knives, fireworks or any other pyrotechnics, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, glass bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles, any articles that are prohibited by the Rules and Regulations, and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to (or ejected from) the Ground."

And

"Under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended) the following are offences for which a person can be arrested by a police officer and conviction could result in a Banning Order being made under the Football Spectators Act 1989 (as amended): The list is non-exhaustive.

"The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse:

"The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse "

We should be very clear. Those responsible for such incidents simply do not care about our club, our reputation or the safety of our fans and we do not want them at our matches. The club will work with the stewards and police to ensure that these matters are addressed and the individuals will be banned from future matches

Ensuring the safety of our supporters and staff is always of paramount importance to Darlington FC 1883. If such behaviour was to continue, the reality is it would only be a matter of time before serious injury is caused and the club in turn would be punished by the league and/or the FA. We will not allow safety to be compromised of the well-behaved and sensible majority by the actions of a tiny minority.

We would also like to draw attention to the possession of pyrotechnics

As a member Club participating in The National League we have been directed to take the strongest action available against anyone found in possession of a Flare, Smoke Bomb or any other such pyrotechnic article(s).

Spectators are warned that we and The National League apply a zero tolerance approach to anyone attempting to bring such article(s) into our Ground/ Stadium.

Due to their chemical makeup, a Flare, Smoke Bomb and all such pyrotechnic article(s) can be highly toxic for some people. This can lead to serious health consequences for those with pre-existing medical conditions and may in certain circumstances cause lifethreatening injury or concern.

In order to protect you, the spectator, we reserve the right to search your person and/or effects and we further reserve the right to pursue legal action, civil or criminal, against any person who contravenes current legislation or our Ground/ Stadium regulations.

To further safeguard all who attend any event at this Ground/ Stadium, we welcome the receipt of any information which will assist us to deter, apprehend/detain and where appropriate prosecute, anyone in possession of; or found discharging or being a party to the discharge of, such an article(s).

We have received the following from Supporters Direct about the reform of FA governance.

More women will be appointed to the Football Association's board as part of proposed reforms after criticism over the way it is run.

In December, five ex-FA bosses asked the government to intervene and change an organisation they described as being held back by "elderly white men". In February, MPs with "no confidence" that the FA would reform itself, warned they could legislate to force it to. Only one woman sits on the current 12-member FA board -Heather Rabbatts.

The FA's proposed reforms seek to: Establish three positions on the FA board reserved for female members by 2018; Reduce the size of the board to 10 members; Add 11 new members to the FA Council so it "better reflects the inclusive and diverse nature of English football"; Limit board membership to three periods of three years'; Introduce term limits for FA Council membership.

The reforms still have to be approved by the FA Council,

which will debate and vote on the recommendations on Monday, 3 April. If they receive majority approval they will be taken forward to a vote of the shareholders at the FA's Annual General Meeting on 18 May. Sports Minister Tracey Crouch has said the FA could lose £30m-£40m of public funding if it does not modernise. FA chairman Greg Clarke reiterated that he will guit if the plans for reform do not win government support. "This is a transformational leap forward and if the government don't accept this. I'm not sure what else we can do. If government don't want to accept it, who am I to argue but. of course, I will resign." he told BBC Sport

BBC Radio 5 live sports news correspondent Richard Conway asked Clarke why there were no plans for dedicated black. Asian and minority ethnic background representation on the proposed new 10-member board. Clarke replied: "What I would like to see is a path to make sure that not only are we gender diverse but ethnically diverse. What I don't want this to be is empty words. I want to find a way to achieve it and be accountable. I just need a bit more time to get there. It's really important that the FA is representative to society. Throughout the business world, diverse boards make better decisions. I think that's true in football too."

The FA is effectively run by its own parliament, the FA Council, which has 122 members. Just eight are women and only four are from ethnic minorities. More than 90 of the 122 members are aged over 60.

This is also an ideal opportunity for anyone that needs some volunteer experience on their CV.

As volunteers you wouldn't receive payment. However, you would be able to park your car and have free entry to the match as well as a hot drink. Also, if you don't have access to a car, we could arrange a lift back to your area of the town after the match.

It is incredible to think that 21 years ago we travelled to London to face Fulham who were lying second bottom of the third division facing possible relegation into the Conference and watched by a paltry two and a half thousand crowd at Craven Cottage. We were riding high third in the table and still with only one away defeat in sixteen league games played so far and so faced the 'Cottagers' with some confidence especially after our good midweek win at Doncaster three days before. Matt Carmichael made his full debut after signing from Doncaster Rovers, while Sean Gregan replaced Phil Brumwell. We got off to an explosive start with Robbie Blake scoring after only two minutes and then adding a second on twenty-four to see us comfortably ahead at the break. Former Quaker Nick Cusack got one back after sixty-eight minutes and then just three minutes from time Michael Mison equalised for the home side to cruelly deny us our first ever victory at Craven Cottage.




