Good afternoon everyone and welcome to the game.

There has been plenty of transfer activity recently, with players coming and going.

Adam Bartlett and Mark Beck have both moved on to pastures new and we wish them all the best at their new clubs except for when they're playing us, of course. We have also received compensation from York City and Harrogate Town respectively for their services.

When Tommy and Alan took over, the directors told them that we would back them financially in the transfer market as far as the budget will allow and at the time of writing, we are pleased to welcome talented trio Josh Heaton, Luke Trotman and Greg Mills to the club.

Tommy and Alan are still assessing the squad and I'm sure they've learned quite a bit about the players, but it takes time to improve the squad as there are so many people and factors involved. Naturally, a new manager wants to freshen his squad to give everyone concerned a lift and if the comments I've seen and heard this week are anything to go by, then he appears to have succeeded in lifting the fans.

It's very important financially that as many fans as possible come through the turnstiles to watch us play at home. The club's budget was calculated last summer based on increased admission prices and an average gate of around 1,800. At the moment, unfortunately, we are around 250 below that figure on average, plus our last two home gates have been below 1,300. The running costs for the club – such as wages, training facilities and transport -- are all fixed for the season, so if our revenue isn't on target, then the chances of the club being run at a profit

and clearing our debts on schedule by the end of the season, are greatly reduced.

It's vitally important that fans rally around the club and encourage others to come along as we enter a promising new era under Tommy, if last Saturday's fightback at Kidderminster is anything to go by.

Tommy showed that he is prepared to change formation and tactics if necessary, and the players showed how strong their character is by coming back from 3-1 down to gain a draw. If the game had gone on much longer, then I suspect that they would have scored a winner. Everyone was buzzing afterwards in the changing room and hopefully it is performances like that, coupled with victories, that encourage fans to keep coming back. It really is important that everyone buys into the principles that we are using to run the club.

At the time of writing these notes, I intend to attend the DFCSG's Annual General Meeting on Thursday night and I am looking forward to working with the newly-elected board members as we plan for a successful and sustainable future.

Finally, I would like to welcome the officials and players from Tamworth, and hope that they have a safe journey home.

Coming to Blackwell Meadows today...

Tamworth are the visitors to Blackwell Meadows today, and Simon Hahn has been doing some research on them.

Welcome back Aman!

We'd like to welcome back midfielder Aman Verma, who played a big part in our run to the FA trophy final at Wembley in 2011.

Aman joined us in November 2010 on loan from Leicester City, and made 34 appearances for us over the rest of that season, and played in every game in that Trophy run, making a big contribution with his goals.

He scored seven times for us, three of them in the Trophy – in the 3-2 home win over Tamworth in the first round, (in front of a crowd of 4321), 4-1 home win over Bath City in the second round, and the 3-0 away win at Telford United in the third round. Only Liam Hatch scored more goals than him in the Trophy run.

Aman came on as a first half sub at Wembley, replacing the injured Gary Smith. After the Wembley celebrations, he returned to his parent club Leicester City.

Since then, he has played for Kettering, Floriana, Stockport, Corby, Kidderminster and Torquay, before joining Tamworth in the summer.



KEY MOMENTS IN THEIR HISTORY

- Set up in 1933 after demise of Tamworth Castle FC
- Reached FA Cup first round twice in 60s, on the second occasion beating Football League club Torquay United to reach the second round, where they lost to Gillingham. They'd lost to Gillingham in the first round three years earlier.
- In 1984 a consortium of local businessmen (which included the current chairman) took over the club and helped them regain their place in the Southern League.
- Won FA Vase in 1989 after a 3-0 win in a replay over Sudbury Town after original game at Wembley was watched by 26,487 people
- Lost in FA Trophy final in 2003 to Burscough 3-0 at Villa Park with 12,000 fans behind them.
- Reached FA Cup third round in 05/06, 06/07 (under Mark Cooper) and in 11/12 when they lost to Everton at Goodison Park
- They were relegated from the Conference Premier in season 2013-14

Despite taking the lead, The Lambs fell to defeat at home to the league leaders Salford City. Tamworth had the better of the early exchanges and Darryl Knights hit the top of the crossbar with a long range strike inside the opening five minutes. Despite the visitors coming back into the game, Tamworth took the lead after 26 minutes through former Quaker Aman Verma. Ben Fox crossed and Verma headed home from close range.

However, the lead last only four minutes, as Mark Shelton struck a long range free kick straight through the wall and into the net to bring the Ammies level. The goal gave Salford encouragement and they had further chances before the break, including a Liam Hogan header that was cleared off the line.

The second half began in end-to-end fashion, but neither was able to create a significant chance. It was Salford who took the lead for the first time on 72 minutes through Mike Phenix with a near post header from a corner.

Tamworth had a huge chance in the final few minutes to earn a point, but Brad Mason was unable to find the target with a free header from just yards out.

MANAGER - ANDY MORRELL

Andy was appointed first team boss on 23 September 2014 after enjoying a successful association with Wrexham where he almost, but not quite, helped The Dragons gain promotion to the Football League in three successive seasons, although they did lift the FA Trophy at Wembley in 2012-13.

Previous to his four season spell in the player-manager role at The Racecourse Ground that ended early in 2014, Andy played at Coventry City, Blackpool and Bury having previously been with the Welsh club a first time between 1998 and 2003 as a player. He also played in the Northern League earlier in his career at Newcastle Blue Star



TOP SCORER - REECE STYCHE

Local lad Reece joined up with Andy Morrell for a second time at The Lamb in January 2017. He made an instant impact in his first spell in 2014-15, scoring on his debut away at Bradford Park Avenue having joined the club just 48 hours previously on a month's loan from Kidderminster Harriers and returned for a second spell on loan in January of the same season scoring twice on his return. He lists local sides Hednesford and Chasetown amongst his handful of previous clubs and made over 100 appearances for Forest Green Rovers before joining League Two side Wycombe Wanderers, Gateshead and then spent time on loan at Nuneaton Town. He has scored ten league goals this season, to make him the joint third top scorer in the league.



CAPTAIN - LUKE JONES

Luke started his career at Blackburn Rovers at Youth and Reserve level and spent a short spell at Cercle Brugge in the Belgian First Division.

After being released by Rovers he spent consecutive seasons at Shrewsbury Town, Kidderminster Harriers, Mansfield, Forest Green Rovers, back at Harriers, back at Mansfield and then Stevenage before re-joining The Stags for a third time from where he became a Lamb in September 2016, signing a contract through to 2018 in December.

TAMWORTH - LAST SEASON

After just missing out on the play-offs the in the 2014/15 and 2015/16 seasons,

Tamworth were again in and around the playoffs for the majority of last season.

They started the season off impressively winning six of their ten games including scoring five times on three occasions. At their highest they briefly sat second in the league table.

After a setback of three games without a win including a 6-0 defeat at Kidderminster they went on a fantastic run. From the middle of October, they won five games on the spin including wins against four of their other play-off contenders one of which was ourselves. The run moved them up into the top five, but after Christmas, much like ourselves, they struggled.

Between Boxing Day and the end of February they lost six of their ten games including a 6-2 defeat at home to Halifax.

Despite winning their last three matches of the campaign they would again miss out on the playoffs. They finished in ninth five points off the last playoff place.

Quakers scored the goal of the season in the 3-2 home win over Tamworth at Blackwell Meadows.

We took the lead after 5 minutes, when Terry Galbraith rose high at the near post to head a long throw from Gary Brown past Tamworth keeper Dan Jezeph for his 10th goal of the season.

But Tamworth equalised with their first real chance on 13 minutes when Dan Newton picked up a long ball from Jezeph, held off Brown, and beat Adam Bartlett with a low left foot shot.

Quakers were denied by Jezeph on three occasions as they tried to regain the lead, but they went back in front on 40 minutes. Chris Hunter's deep cross from the right was cleared only as far as Stephen Thompson, who controlled the ball well on his chest, and then neatly volleyed across the keeper into the top corner from six yards out.

At the start of the second half it was nearly 3-1 when David Syers burst into the box and set up Beck, whose left shot was well saved by Jezeph. And in Quakers next attack from the left, Gillies

played a 1-2 with Syers, and Jezeph was in the right place on the line to hold on to the ball.

Quakers deservedly went 3-1 up on 53 minutes with the best goal of the season. Syers cleverly backheeled the ball into the path of David Ferguson who ran into the box and found Nathan Cartman, who played a 1-2 with Mark Beck before knocking the ball home.

Tamworth pulled a goal back on 66 minutes when a low corner came in from the right, and Ross Dyer, on the corner of the six yard box, flicked the ball past Bartlett.

Tamworth nearly equalised when Brandon Fox turned on the corner of the box and curled a right foot shot towards the top corner, and Bartlett just managed to fingertip the ball over the top.

Quakers nearly made it 4-2 on 73 minutes, with Thompson very unlucky not to score. He picked the ball up inside his own half, ran at the Tamworth defence to the edge of the box where he had a shot charged down - Quakers appealed for handball in vain - but he kept possession, lobbed the keeper, and the ball struck the crossbar.

Welcome to our new signings



Manager Tommy Wright has been busy in the transfer market in the last ten days, and has brought in three new signings.



Centre half **Josh Heaton**, 21, has signed from Evostik First Division North club Ramsbottom, and made his debut for us in the centre of defence at Kidderminster last Saturday.

He spent several years working his way through the age groups at Preston North End and signed a professional contract, but he was released by Preston boss Simon Grayson in the summer of 2016. He went on to play for Droylsden, Stalybridge and Bamber Bridge – when a proposed move to us broke down because he was injured – before moving on to Ramsbottom.



Left winger **Greg Mills**, 27, has an impressive scoring record for a player in that position, having scored 29 goals in 74 appearances in National League North for Corby, Tamworth and Nuneaton.

He started his career at Derby County and made two first team appearances for them, before moving on to Telford United, Worcester, Boston and Barrow, before he joined forces with current Darlo manager Tommy Wright at Corby. He helped Corby win promotion from the Southern League, and scored 53 goals in 110 appearances.

He joined Tamworth at the start of the 2016-17, and then joined his old boss at Nuneaton in January this year.



Right back **Luke Trotman**, 20, has also come from Nuneaton. He started his career at Luton Town and was on the brink of first team football when he unfortunately broke his leg.

When he had recovered, he moved to St Neot's Town and then on to Loughborough, where Tommy Wright, then manager of Nuneaton, spotted him in action and signed him for the National League North club last summer.

He put in some promising performances for Nuneaton, and played against us in the 2-1 game at Nuneaton last month.

We would like to welcome all three new signings to Darlington, and wish them a long and happy stay with us.

Tamworth NAMES + GAMES

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS looks at Tamworth's leading lights

CLASSIC CAMPAIGN – 2002-03

Tamworth won the Southern League title and were FA Trophy finalists in 2002-03. Having just missed out on promotion on the final day of the previous season, Darren Gee's team made an inconsistent start to the campaign but a run of 38 points from a possible 42 took them into a strong position by Christmas. Skipper Mark Cooper was top scorer as they won the championship by a 13 point margin. In the FA Trophy they beat Accrington Stanley 4-1, Nuneaton Borough 3-0, Stevenage Borough 3-0, Margate 2-0, Farnborough Town 2-1 and Havant & Waterlooville 2-1 before losing 2-1 to Burscough in the final at Villa Park.

MARK COOPER



Player-boss Mark Cooper guided Tamworth to the FA Cup third round in 2005-06. Initially with Bristol City, he followed his father Terry to Exeter in October 1989, then Birmingham. He had spells at Fulham, Huddersfield and Wycombe, joining his father at Exeter in February 1994, then played for Hartlepool, Macclesfield, Leyton Orient, Rushden & Diamonds, Hednesford and Forest Green.

Moving to Tamworth in May 2002, he starred as they were Southern League champions and FA Trophy finalists in 2002-03, since managing Kettering, Peterborough, Darlington, Telford, Swindon, Notts County and Forest Green Rovers.

STEVE FOX

Skilful winger Steve Fox had two spells with hometown Tamworth. He played for the Lambs as a 15 year old and turned professional with Birmingham City in February 1976, appearing in the top-flight before moving to Wrexham for £95,000 in December 1978. Voted their 'Player of the Year' in 1980-81, he featured in two Welsh Cup finals and successive Cup runs. He joined Port Vale in October 1982 and starred in their 1982-83 promotion triumph. Reuniting with John McGrath at Chester in July 1984, he later played for Rhyl, Llangollen and Tamworth again. He became a gardener in Tamworth and died in December 2012.

COLIN GREEN

Former Welsh international left-back Colin Green was capped 15 times before joining Tamworth for two seasons. Signing professional for Everton in February 1959, he marked Stanley Matthews on his First Division debut against Blackpool in September 1960 and moved to Birmingham City in December 1962. He helped win the League Cup that season and reach the FA Cup semi-finals in 1967-68. Following a loan spell at Wrexham, he joined Tamworth in May 1971 and was an experienced figure as they won the West Midlands

League and Cup 'double' in 1971-72. Later with Rhyl, he was a sales rep in his native Wrexham.

IAN MOORES

Former England U-23 striker Ian Moores scored in Tamworth's 1989 FA Vase final triumph. Signing professional for Stoke City in June 1972, he was joint leading marksman in 1975-76 and moved to Tottenham Hotspur for £90,000 in August 1976. He helped them regain top-flight status in 1977-78, joining Orient with Ralph Coates for £55,000 in September 1978. Moving to Bolton Wanderers in July 1982, he joined Apoel in June 1983 and was an experienced figure as they won the Cypriot League and Cup. He later played for Tamworth and Swedish side Landskrona Bols but tragically died in January 1998.

BOB TAYLOR

Experienced striker Bob Taylor was Tamworth's leading marksman in 2004-05. Initially with Horden Colliery, he joined Leeds United in January 1986 and was swapped for Bristol City's Carl Shutt in March 1989. He was top scorer in their 1989-90 promotion success, moving to West Brom in January 1992 and starring in the 1992-93 Second Division play-off final triumph. Joining Bolton Wanderers in January 1998, he returned to West Brom and helped them win promotion in 2001-02. He moved via Cheltenham Town to Tamworth in August 2004, scoring 19 goals in 60 Conference games, since working in the building trade.

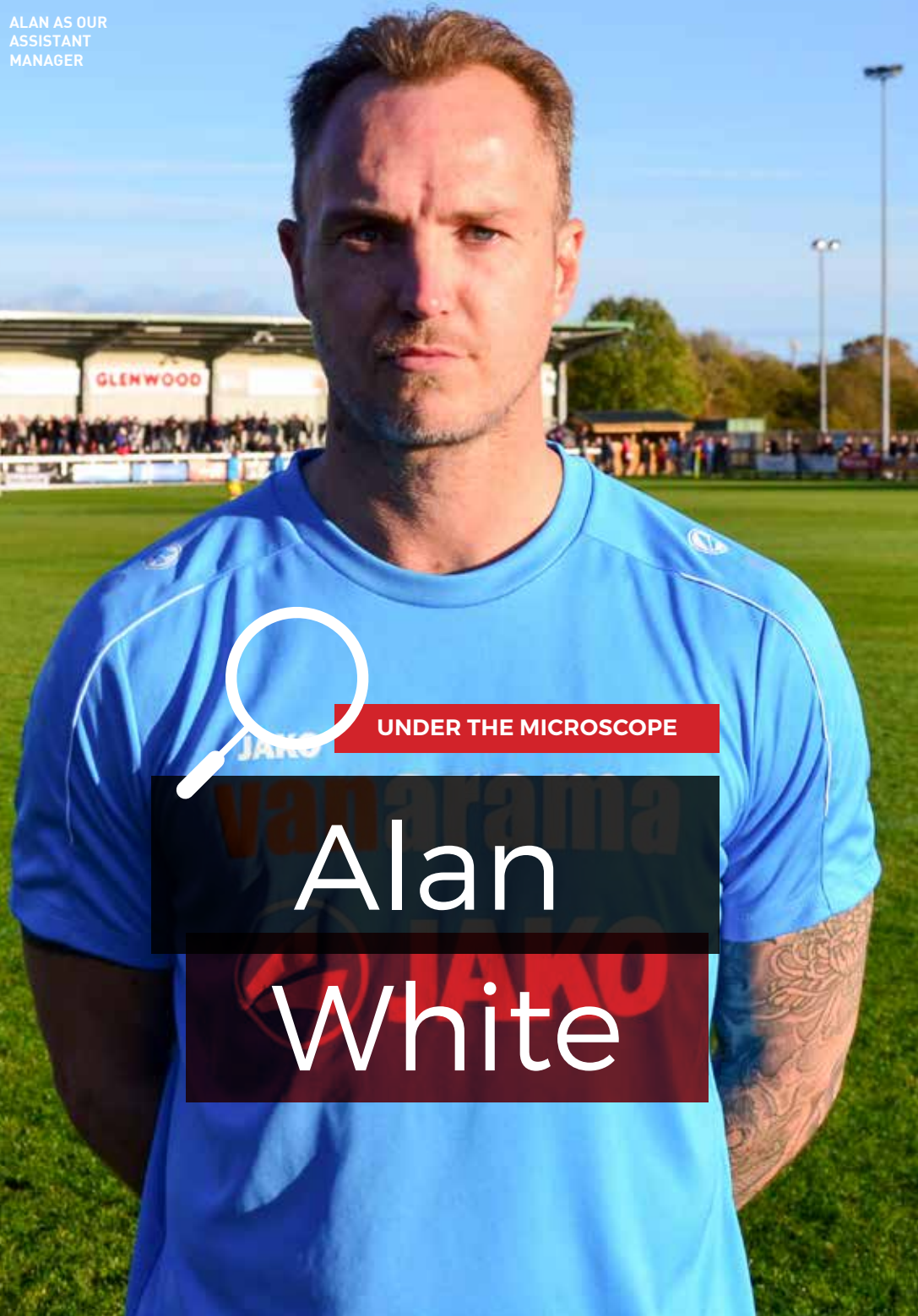

UNDER THE MICROSCOPE

Alan White

Assistant manager Alan White is starting his fourth spell at Darlington – he spoke to Ray Simpson

Alan's roots with the club run very deep – he first started coming along to matches with his brother, dad and granddad in the mid-80s, and was a mascot with his brother at a home game in 1985 against Wigan Athletic. He went on to play in three separate spells for his hometown club, and now he's returned as Tommy Wright's number two.

"My brother, Stephen, and I were delighted to be mascots. He led the teams on to the field and I was behind him, but he turned the wrong way, quickly realised what he'd done, so changed his mind! Trouble was, he clattered into me, and we both fell to the ground! I've still got a video of it somewhere.

"My favourite player from that time was Alan Roberts, and my brother's favourite player was David Currie. I also liked Garry MacDonald and Paul Ward. I've even got one of Freddie Barber's gloves somewhere, it'll be a bit crusty now though.

"We all used to watch the game from the steps in the old East Stand, or from the Polam Lane End. They were great times, thoroughly enjoyable. I used to go to the Quaker Sports centre on a Saturday morning for coaching as well.

"When my own football career really got under way with Middlesbrough, obviously I didn't get to games much, but I still watched how the results were going. I couldn't get to the play off finals in 1996 and 2000, but instead I watched them from my mate's house

in Middleton Tyas. I was really disappointed that we lost both those games, just like all the other Darlo fans. I still don't know how we lost against Peterborough in 2000.

"I could have been playing for Darlo in season 1999-2000. Hodgy contacted me about joining the club and we agreed a deal, but then George Reynolds got in touch and wanted to me to take half of what I'd been offered, and the deal fell through."

That was in the early part of the 1999-2000 season, and instead Alan remained at his then club Luton Town, before moving on to Colchester, Leyton Orient, Boston and Notts County.

He popped up on the Darlington radar again in 2007, and this time Dave Penney successfully landed him.

"Darlo and Peterborough were both in for me at the time. I spoke to Dave Penney, and I liked what he said and what he was offering. I knew that Peterborough were interested, and I asked Dave for a couple of days to think about the deal and wait to see what Peterborough were going to offer. But they never got in touch in time, so I signed for Darlington.

"Dave brought in a good set of lads – for instance Tim Ryan, Ricky Ravenhill, Julian Joachim, Pawel Abbott, Tommy – and built a really good team. There was a great team spirit involving so many different personalities. We all got on like a house on fire, and that's how Tommy and I struck

up a friendship.

"We were all fiercely competitive. There was a fight in training at least once a week, but then it was all forgotten about ten minutes later when we were sat down for our dinners – but Tommy and I never had a fight. We all stuck up for each other on the field though, we made sure of that."

Quakers missed out on promotion because of injuries in 2008, and then early in 2009 when Quakers were in the promotion positions, came the damaging second administration.

"Most of us left because we weren't getting paid. Dave Penney left near the end of the season for Oldham, so did Martin Gray and most of the players. I went back to Luton Town, where Mick Harford was manager and played a few games there, but then Richard Money was appointed. He called me and a couple of the other older lads into his office one day, and told us that we weren't required.

"I then had a phone call from Kevin Richardson, who asked if I fancied coming back to Darlington again. He was assistant manager to Steve Staunton. I knew that I would be playing regularly, even though the club was having a difficult time because of the administration, and they'd already had one manager that season in Colin Todd. Plus, they were my home town team, and I wanted to help.

"It was a difficult time, and I thought that Steve Staunton's style of management >>

>> didn't suit that level of football. He was used to players much higher up the ladder at Liverpool, Aston Villa and the Republic of Ireland – we didn't do setpieces for example, because he said that they hadn't done them where he'd played because the players knew where to go instinctively. It's not like that at League Two level, players need to be told.

"There were one or two good performances, particularly at Rotherham one night, but there was a general air of resignation and despondency around the club – a defeatist attitude if you like."

Quakers were relegated from the Football League and beyond in the next two years. Alan went to Gateshead, Blyth and Harrogate Town and returned again for spell number three at the start of the 2014-15 season. Quakers' second in the EvoStik First Division North.

"I've had a great career, I reckon that I've played over 750 games since my first debut for Luton, and had eight years in the First Division, and until that season, I'd never won a promotion medal of any sort.

"So to beat Spennymoor and then Bamber Bridge in the play offs that season was fantastic, and I felt a bit emotional when I got my medal."

Many would argue that the EvoStik Premier season in 2015-16 was the best in Quakers' recent history, capped by that unforgettable night when the title was lifted in sensational style by 7-1 at Whitby.

"What a fantastic night that was. Martin, Brian, Sean and I spoke before the game, and we discussed about changing things after 20 minutes if they weren't going according to plan. We talked mainly about the shape of the side.

"After 15 minutes we were 3-0 up! Martin turned around to me and joked: 'What do we do now?' Then the fourth and the fifth went in. It was a night when we could sit back and enjoy the game, which is a very rare feeling in a game that had so much riding on it. I think Thommo had a rocket pack on his back that night, he was everywhere. I was fortunate enough to get on for the last ten minutes."

"I left in the summer because there were no coaching

roles available for me, so Spennymoor came in for me. I won another medal last season in the EvoStik League Premier.

"Martin then left Darlington, and Tommy got the job. He then got in touch with me and asked me if I fancied being his assistant – so I went to a meeting with him, John Tempest and David Johnston.

"They talked about their plans for the club and how they wanted to achieve the club's ambitions. Obviously I knew plenty about the club, that people are very committed to it and that there are lots of hard working volunteers. It didn't long for me to say yes!

"Tommy and I want to give the club some new direction with our enthusiasm and energy, and want the players to play with freedom and express themselves, but we can only do that with a solid foundation.

"We'll be working very hard on our strengths and weaknesses in the next few weeks."

HOW THE OTHERS ARE DOING

A relentless Salford moved seven points clear at the top of the table after coming from behind to win 2-1 at today's visitors to Blackwell Meadows, Tamworth. Since the opening day of the season, the Ammies have lost only one of 17 league games.

Second-placed Harrogate Town do have a game in hand, but lost further ground with a 3-1 defeat at Spennymoor. It's just one win in four for Harrogate in the league.

Five straight wins have seen Brackley Town recover from a spell of a patchy form. The Saints are a point above Harrogate in second, after beating Southport 4-0 in midweek.

That win over Harrogate confirmed Spennymoor's status as promotion contenders. Moors have six wins from their last eight games and are just a point behind Brackley.

Another point further back are Blyth Spartans, who've seven wins from their last 10 games. Spartans have alternated wins and defeats in their last five matches.

York City made it back-to-back wins by beating Alfreton 3-2 last weekend. Three goals in those two victories have taken Jon Parkin's tally for the season into double figures. Adam Bartlett saved a last minute penalty.

Another side who've recorded back-to-back wins are Bradford PA. They've moved into the play-off places after a win at North Ferriby last weekend.

They're above eighth-placed Chorley on goals scored. The Magpies have lost only one of their last six, although two draws in a row have seen them slip out of the top seven.

Stockport County are a point off the play-offs, although their form of late has been mixed. The Hatters have four wins, four defeats and two draws from 10 league games.

A point further back are today's opponents Tamworth, who've won just once in their last six games. That victory was at York City, their only away win in the league since August.

11th-placed Curzon Ashton have dropped out

of the play-off places after taking just one point from their previous three league games.

Unbeaten in their last five league games, Kidderminster Harriers are three points behind the play-offs.

AFC Telford are below Darlington on goal difference, having lost five and won four of their last 10.

Defeat at Brackley on Tuesday meant that Southport remained 15th in the table. Kevin Davies' side haven't won any of their last ten matches.

Alfreton Town are four points above the relegation zone after losing to FC United in midweek.

Leamington's resurgence seems to have ground to a halt. After going unbeaten in seven in the league, the Midlands have lost back-to-back games against Boston and Blyth Spartans.

A run of four games unbeaten had lifted Gainsborough Trinity out of the bottom three. Their mini-revival took a setback though, as they lost to Brackley last weekend to stay only two points above the relegation places.

FC United moved four points away from the bottom three after beating Alfreton 3-2 in midweek after being 2-0 down at half time, scoring twice in the last five minutes. They beat Telford previous to Tuesday night.

That result put Nuneaton, who could only draw at Chorley, into the bottom three. Tommy Wright's former side have taken only a point from their last four matches.

A win and a draw from their last two games have improved Boston's poor form. Prior to that, they'd taken only a point from seven matches.

And bottom club North Ferriby already look doomed. They are 10 points adrift of safety, having won just once in the league all season.

Kyle Lafferty has urged football to reassess its relationship with bookmakers as he faces up to an addiction he admits he may spend the rest of his life tackling.

Two months ago, the Hearts and Northern Ireland striker, who had a loan spell at Darlington from Burnley in 2006 during which he played nine games, publicly admitted gambling was a vice he had been wrestling with through his entire career.

The 30 year old was in Switzerland last weekend with Northern Ireland – where he had fed his gambling habit with punts on ice hockey during a season at Sion – in a better frame of mind even if he has been told that he faces a lengthy fight battling his demons.

"I was at a Gamblers Anonymous meeting last week with John Hartson and a guy picked up his 35 year old pin," Lafferty explained.

"He's gone to every single meeting, two a week. I spoke to him after and I said: "Why so long?" He said "You need to do it."

"There was another guy who said: "Whenever you think you are over it, there is a chance you could fall back in."

"You need as much help as you can and there are lots of people who are helping me, and then there will be others who want me to fail. I've finally got my mind in the right place, I'm going to do this for my family and myself."

The struggle will be greater given his chosen field's association with bookmakers.

When Joey Barton was given an 18 month ban, later reduced to 13 by the Football Association for multiple breaches of its betting regulations, the midfielder decried the sport's links with the gambling industry.

Lafferty, who was fined by the FA himself in 2016 for breaking betting rules, can see his point.

"Everywhere you look in Scotland, it's the William Hill Cup, the Ladbrokes Premier League and you are playing a game and Bet365 is going

around the advertising boards.

"No matter what app you put up on your phone, there is something to do with betting, like live scores. You can't get away from it. Everywhere you look there is something to do with betting.

"I think people need to look at it because if you have a problem, it is difficult to get away from it, unless you are going to be brave and come out about it and get help, and it's difficult."

In this week's Memory Match, Simon Weatherill looks back at the night when Quakers almost shocked First Division Derby County in the quarter finals of the Football League Cup on 29th November 1967.

Darlington's best ever showing in the Football League Cup was 50 years ago, in the 1967/68 season. The Quakers were back in the familiar surroundings of Division 4 after promotion in 65/66 was followed by immediate relegation in 66/67. The league campaign had not started too promisingly. Two wins from the first 13 games (both away from home) meant that the Quakers were already struggling at the wrong end of the table and it was the 23rd October before they finally won a game at Feethams, at the seventh attempt.

The team saved their best performances for the League Cup competition -- they obviously preferred playing under floodlights! Quakers beat York City 1-0 at home, Southend United away 2-1, Portsmouth at home 4-1 and Millwall at home by 2-0.

Millwall must have been particularly impressed by Conlon's performance against them as they returned two weeks later to sign him up. Amazingly the victory put the Quakers into the quarter finals of the competition, but the draw was unkind to them, giving them an away tie at Brian Clough's Derby County. The game would take place on Wednesday 29th November 1967.

By the time the Derby game came around, the Quakers' league form hadn't improved to any great degree. They sat in 18th place in the Division 4 table with 15 points from 18 games. Derby sat in 10th place in Division 2, and boasted one of the most potent strike forces in the country. John O'Hare and Kevin Hector had already scored 25 goals between them in 22 league and cup games. County's goalkeeper was veteran Reg Matthews, who probably had a few sleepless nights about facing the Quakers in a cup tie again. He had been the Chelsea keeper in the 1958 FA Cup tie when he'd conceded 7 goals in their two games! Darlington had to wait on a late fitness test on right half Ian Davidson before naming their team. Davidson had pulled a muscle against Rochdale on the previous Saturday, and was classed as doubtful, but passed the test and took his place in an unchanged team.

A crowd of 23,361 turned out at the Baseball Ground to see a pulsating cup-tie, fought out on an absolute glue pot of a pitch. The first half was end to end, played at breathtaking pace. Darlington were first to go close, in the 12th minute. Don Ratcliffe received a pass from Les O'Neill and hit a tremendous first time drive,

which Matthews only just managed to turn round the post. At the other end Tony Moor had to be alert, saving well from Alan Durban and John O'Hare. Phil Waller also went close for the home side and there were some anxious moments from several corners, which the Quakers defence managed to scramble clear. The visitors were giving as good as they got though and Brian Albeson went close twice, first with a fierce drive which was blocked, then with a fine header from a corner which Matthews did well to save at the foot of the post. Just when it seemed that the first half would finish goalless, the Quakers grabbed the lead in the 45th minute. Les O'Neill beautifully jinking past two defenders and slotting a low drive just inside the post. Half time: Derby County 0 Darlington 1.

The Quakers had to make a change at half time. Davidson's muscle injury got the better of him and he failed to appear for the second half. Substitute Joe Jacques taking his place. Darlington took time to reorganise and within 10 minutes of the second half starting, Derby had rattled in three goals, although there was an element of good fortune about two of them. In the 52nd minute Durban hit a shot, which Moor seemed

to have covered, but the ball took a huge deflection off Brian Keeble and found its way into the net. A minute later, County were in front, with Durban scoring again from close range after Moor could only parry a shot by O'Hare. Then, in the 55th minute they increased their lead to 3-1, but there was an element of controversy about it. Moor appeared to be fouled in a goalmouth scramble but nothing was given and Gordon Hughes slammed home Derby's third. Darlington kept plugging away and reduced the arrears on the hour when Bobby Cummings fired home the loose ball after Matthews had fumbled a left wing cross. The game continued to be end to end in the clawing mud, but the home side seemed to make the game safe with two goals in three minutes. In the 71st minute Ritchie Barker found space in the penalty area and sent

Moor the wrong way to make in 4-2. Three minutes later it was five, when an under pressure Les O'Neill tried a back pass but struck it too firmly and it evaded Keeble's desperate lunge to roll into the net. Darlington never gave up though and continued to push forward. Ratcliffe jinked through in the 82nd minute and fired under the diving Matthews to make it 5-3, and then in the 87th minute Joe Jacques headed in off the post to make the final score 5-4.

The Quakers had run out of time and had ultimately been beaten by the three goal burst just after half time, but they certainly

hadn't disgraced themselves in an enthralling cup tie. "There wasn't a single weakness," said manager Jimmy Greenhalgh after the game. "This was a better performance than our victories over Portsmouth and Millwall. I was proud of the lads, they played like heroes".

Derby produced a 16 page programme for the game, priced at 9d. It included two pages entitled "Introducing Our Visitors" with a brief outline of the season so far, plus pen pictures of the Darlington players. The team line-ups were on the centre pages.

Here are Darlington Feethams Under 8s, who have won most of their matches so far in the Teesside Junior Football Alliance.

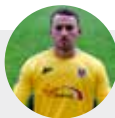
All of the club's youth teams are doing well this season throughout the various age groups, and there are some really good youngsters emerging.

came back from 3-2 down to win 4-3 at Farsley Celtic. Vinny Steels scored in both of those games.

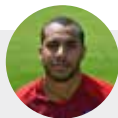

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Blackwell Meadows to our visitors from Staffordshire, Tamworth FC. Having being narrowly beaten 2-1 by league leaders Salford City last weekend, "The Lambs" will be determined to make amends – signifying another tough game for the Quakers.

We would like to announce that we are targeting the Salford home game as a crowdfunding match. We are asking supporters as they pass through the turnstiles to donate money that will go directly towards the Raise the Roof fund.

Over the last five years we have raised an incredible amount of money and our community share pitches have been a very effective and popular way of raising funds with people often investing thousands of pounds. For this match though we are aiming to get as many supporters contributing to help us reach our £50,000 target before the deadline of December 31st. By getting matchday fans to donate as they pass through the turnstiles we hope to reach a lot more supporters and a little bit contributed by many will be a massive boost to our fundraising. Whether its £1, £10, £20 or more any funds are very gratefully received and will go directly towards Raise the Roof.

At the time of writing we are near the £30,000 mark after just 5 weeks of fundraising and with the target set at £50,000 your contributions will make a real difference. We welcome as our guests today a team of volunteers from Northumbrian Water Ltd:

Dean Blackburn, Shaun Tones, Glen Donald, Alan Stobart, Chris Westwood and Mark Graham. Thanks to their efforts we now have the benefits of our programme kiosk. The lads toiled away on a very, very wet day at the end of September to pave what was the grassed area outside the home turnstiles on which the kiosk now stands.

DFCSG AGM - Thursday 16th November

The AGM reported on the year ending 30 June 2017 and whilst this has been a very challenging one for DFCSG, it has been a successful one in many respects.

'Back to Darlo' The most notable challenge and success has been the Community Share offer that raised £100,000 to support the re-development at Blackwell Meadows, resulting in the return of Darlington Football Club to their home town. In addition, DFCSG promoted the 'Buy the Dug-Outs and Goals' initiatives that raised a further £10,000. Also DFCSG used reserves to purchase £30,000 of equity in Darlington Football Club. These additional investments were necessary to meet unforeseen additional costs in the re-development of Blackwell Meadows. Of course, DFCSG were only the facilitators in the fundraising. The real heroes were the wonderful and generous fans of Darlington Football Club, who provided the vital funds.

Infrastructure Improvements In April, DFCSG launched a second Community Share offer. This time it was to raise funds to improve the infrastructure at Blackwell Meadows. The first phase was successful in raising £43,000 to re-lay the pitch (this was match-funded by the Football Stadium Improvement Fund). The second phase to raise £150,000 to extend the seated stand is on-going.

Transport to matches DFCSG has continued to organise convenient transport for our fans to away matches. Not only is this a comfortable and cost effective way for fans to travel to away matches it also generates a surplus which increases the amount DFCSG can re-invest in the club. Last season, the surplus was £3,800.

General Fund Raising The DFCSG are directly involved in a number of fundraising activities which have provided vital funds to support the operations of the Football Club. The match-day 50:50 draw promoted by DFCSG raised £8,000 last season. In addition, DFCSG operates the 'Fans Lottery' and membership has grown from 423 to 625 during the year and generated

almost £17,000 for the Football Club.

The DFCSG also manages the bucket collections at home matches. These initially supported the move to Blackwell Meadows but the proceeds now go to the 'Ground Development Fund' to support future infrastructure projects. Over the year £4,982 was collected.

Community Engagement Whilst the Football Club was based in Bishop Auckland, DFCSG's community engagement was generally limited to holding collections on an annual basis for the Kings' Church Food Bank.

Having the Football Club based in the town should increase the potential for community engagement.

Governance of Darlington Football Club. DFCSG's purchase of £30,000 of equity combined with the acquisition of £57,000 of equity via the Share Exchange Scheme linked to the Community Share Offer has increased DFCSG's voting rights in Darlington Football Club to over 80%, which represents a controlling interest and provides the ability for the DFCSG board to make any changes in the constitution or running of the football club as determined democratically by the DFCSG membership. DFCSG's membership also grew significantly and stood at 1082 on 30th June, up from 677 in 2016.

For DFCSG's controlling interest in Darlington Football Club to mean anything, DFCSG needs to establish an engagement framework with DFC that will allow DFCSG an appropriate level of involvement in 3 key areas: Strategy & Planning, Operations and Finance. The DFCSG board has developed a draft engagement framework. However, as a consequence of the concentrated efforts to engineer the move to Blackwell Meadows, as well as changes in personnel at board level within the Football Club, there has been no opportunity to establish an engagement framework between Darlington Football Club and DFCSG.

Thursday's AGM saw a new DFCSG board elected (details of the new are available at www.dfcs.co.uk) and going forward, it is hoped that the new board will be able to give some focus to establishing an engagement framework as well as expanding the level of community engagement.

REMINDER OF DARLINGTON FOOTBALL CLUB'S

GROUND REGULATIONS



We would also like to draw attention to the possession of pyrotechnics

As a member Club participating in The National League we have been directed to take the strongest action available against anyone found in possession of a Flare, Smoke Bomb or any other such pyrotechnic article(s).

Spectators are warned that we and The National League apply a zero tolerance approach to anyone attempting to bring such article(s) into our Ground/Stadium.

Due to their chemical make-up, a Flare, Smoke Bomb and all such pyrotechnic article(s) can be highly toxic for some people. This can lead to serious health consequences for those with pre-existing medical conditions and may in certain circumstances cause life-threatening injury or concern.

In order to protect you, the spectator, we reserve the right to search your person and/or effects and we further reserve the right to pursue legal action, civil or criminal, against any person who contravenes current legislation or our Ground/Stadium regulations.

To further safeguard all who attend any event at this Ground/Stadium, we welcome the receipt of any information which will assist us to deter, apprehend/detain and where appropriate prosecute, anyone in possession of, or found discharging or being a party to the discharge of, such an article(s).

In home games last season, there were incidents involving a flare, some coin throwing and fans encroaching on to the field of play. Accordingly, we have been requested to remind fans about our ground regulations.

These regrettable incidents are contrary to our ground regulations, as published on our official website on 12th October last year, and again last week.

The pertinent regulations are as follows:

"The following articles must not be brought within the Ground - knives, fireworks or any other pyrotechnics, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, glass bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles, any articles that are prohibited by the Rules and Regulations, and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to (or ejected from) the Ground."

And

"Under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended) the following are offences for which a person can be arrested by a police officer and conviction could result in a Banning Order being made under the Football Spectators Act 1989 (as amended): The list is non-exhaustive.

"The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse;

"The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse."

We should be very clear. Those responsible for such incidents simply do not care about our club, our reputation or the safety of our fans and we do not want them at our matches. The club will work with the stewards and police to ensure that these matters are addressed and the individuals will be banned from future matches.

Ensuring the safety of our supporters and staff is always of paramount importance to Darlington FC 1883. If such behaviour was to continue, the reality is it would only be a matter of time before serious injury is caused and the club in turn would be punished by the league and/or the FA. We will not allow safety to be compromised of the well-behaved and sensible majority by the actions of a tiny minority.

On This Day

In this series, we look back at Darlington matches on the corresponding day in our history

November 11th 1922

Third Division North

Darlington 4 Wrexham 1, attendance 4107

We were adjusting to life quite nicely in the newly formed Third Division North. We finished second in its inaugural season, and were again pushing for the title in season 1922-23.

We were unbeaten at home so far in the season, having drawn with Ashington, and beaten Accrington Stanley, Barrow and Walsall.

We'd played Wrexham in the reverse fixture the week before, drawing 0-0 at the Racecourse Ground, and we found the home game a little easier, winning 4-1 with goals from Bill Hooper, George Stevens, Ernie Young and Peter Bell scoring the goals.

November 18th 1950

Third Division North

Darlington 3 Accrington Stanley 0, attendance 5,582

This was our fifth post war season, but we'd only finished in the top half of the Third Division North once in that time.

We lost our first two home games of the season against Rochdale and Mansfield, but went unbeaten in our next six, which was a good job really as we'd only won once away in the season up to that point.



Accrington Stanley were below us in the table at that point, and we comfortably beat them 3-0, with goals from Ron Steel (2) and John Ward.

The good home form didn't last though, because a week later we were thumped 7-2 at home by Rotherham United in the first round of the FA Cup.

November 18th 1989

FA Cup first round

Darlington 6 Northwich Victoria 2, attendance 3,334

We were in the Conference in this season, and were going well at the top of the table, although we had only picked up one point from our last two away games, against Macclesfield and Farnborough.

We'd already played in the FA cup once, beating Runcorn 4-2, and Northwich Victoria were reckoned to be one of our main rivals for the title, and so were expected to give us a tough game.

However, we discovered our best form, thumping them 6-2, with David Cork, Les McJannet, David Corner (2) and Andy Toman and Dale Anderson scoring the goals.

We kept the Cup run going – we beat Halifax in the next round before losing to Cambridge in a third round replay.
