TAMWORTH - THEIR SEASON SO FAR

After just missing out on the play-offs in the last two seasons, Tamworth have been in and around the play-offs for most of this campaign.

They started the season off impressively winning six of their first ten games including scoring five times on three occasions. At their highest they briefly sat second in the league table.

After a setback of three games without a win including a 6-0 defeat at Kidderminster they went on a fantastic run. From the middle of October they won five games on the spin including wins against four of their other play-off contenders one of which was Darlington. The run moved them up into the top five, but after Christmas, they have struggled.

Between Boxing Day and the end of February they lost six of their ten games including a 6-2 defeat at home to Halifax.

They have still managed to pick up impressive victories, including ones over Brackley and Salford, but they have not been able to get back into the top five.

With five games to go they sit five points behind us and seven off the final play-off place.

Tamworth moved up to ninth with a victory after leading three times at home to Harrogate last Saturday. The hosts started on top and took the lead after 18 minutes after a long kick from Jezeph in the Tamworth goal was controlled by Newton on the edge of the area, before beating one man and firing low inside the far post.

Chances came at both ends and Harrogate striker Ainge twice came close to levelling through a volley and then a header. Newton nearly doubled Tamworth's lead as he struck the outside of the post with a dipping effort, but it remained 1-0 at half-time.

The second half started slowly, but the visitors levelled on the hour mark through Burrell's header which looped up over Jezeph.

With 12 minutes left the hosts regained the lead after Styche was fouled by goalkeeper Crook in the box and Newton smashed home his 21st of the season from the penalty spot.

Four minutes later and it was all square again, Ainge headed it into the danger area and Day helped it over the line.

However, there was still time for Ben Fox to find space on the edge of the area and fire into the bottom corner to give Tamworth the three points.

Previous to his four season spell in the player-manager role at The Racecourse Ground that ended early in 2014, Andy played at Coventry City, Blackpool and Bury having previously been with the Welsh club a first time between 1998 and 2003 as a

player. He started his career at Northern League club Newcastle Blue Star.

Adam signed for Quakers just before the signing deadline following his release by Hartlepool.

He started his career at Newcastle United, and advanced through the age groups to the reserve team squad, but never made it to the first team.

He moved to Blyth in 2005, who were managed at that time by our own Harry Dunn in the Conference North, and his performances were good enough for him to be called up into the England C squad.

When he was 22, he moved to Kidderminster who were then in the Conference National, and after a season there moved into the Football League with Hereford.

He stayed at Edgar Street for three years, before moving back northwards to Gateshead in 2012, and after making over 100 appearances for them, including one in the play off final, he was released in 2015 and snapped up by Hartlepool where he stayed until last month.

Adam had an eventful few days before he signed for Quakers, and he explained; "I was released by Hartlepool on the Monday, started working for Middlesbrough as a goalkeeping coach on the Wednesday, and signed for Darlington on the Thursday.

"The Middlesbrough job was offered to me a week or two previous, and it involves coaching

the youngsters from Under 9s to Under 16s.

"I have a UEFA licence to coach, I did my badges when I was at Gateshead and then Hartlepool, and I'd been doing part time coaching at Middlesbrough.

"I received a phone call from Middlesbrough offering me a full time job, and I had a choice to make – should I turn the job down and remain a full time pro or should I take it and have more security?

"I knew that when Dave Jones took over as Hartlepool manager my days would be numbered, and I asked myself if I wanted to see my contract out and play second fiddle? I didn't want to do that, because I'm used to playing regular football. The Hartlepool keeper, Trevor Carson, picked up an injury, and I knew that when he was fit again, I had no chance of displacing him – after all he is the first choice for Northern Ireland.

"Ever since I joined Blyth after leaving Newcastle, I've played regular football – over 450 games confirms that. Somehow, Martin Gray knew that my situation was changing and that I was going to leave Hartlepool, and he contacted me and asked if I would like to join Darlington.

"I didn't need much persuasion. Darlington are the biggest non league club by far in the north east, and the success over the last five years has been phenomenal. The fan base is big as well, and so when I signed for Darlington, it topped a great week."

Adam, who has played alongside Phil Turnbull, Gary Brown and Josh Gillies in the past, moved up the football ladder to Kidderminster following his departure from Blyth, and it was at the end of a successful season there when he played at Wembley – but for a different club at 48 hours' notice. "Kidderminster had just missed out on the play offs, and so I went for training with England C ahead of a game in Belgium.

"Cambridge were in the play off final, and their keeper was injured in a training session just a couple of days before the game. Their back up keeper was only 18 years old, and they got special dispensation from the league to sign an emergency keeper.

"I received a call from Cambridge after I'd been training with England C one morning, asking if I would like to play at Wembley two days later! Of course I agreed, who wouldn't turn the chance down?

"So I played in the final, and unfortunately we lost 2-0 against Torquay in front of 40,000 fans. It was a great experience, and I felt that I did myself justice.

"That appearance put me in the shop window, and I had a lot of offers after that from several Football League clubs, so I decided to join Hereford United when they were in the Football League. It was a step upwards that I wanted to take. Oxford and Torquay were also interested.

"Hereford had just been relegated to League Two, and were being run by owner Graham Turner and manager John Trewick. For a while things looked good, but then Graham sold the club and it went downhill after that. I was an ever present for two seasons.

"I came back north to Gateshead, and played there for three years, and in one season we played 75 per cent of our home games away from home because our ground wasn't fit. We played a home game at Boston once, which was bizarre so far away from Gateshead.

"In my third season we got to Wembley in the play off final and lost unfortunately."

Adam believes that Quakers can make the play offs at the end of the season.

"I'm impressed at the strength of the team spirit. There's a real never-say-die attitude in the dressing room, as the lads have proved in every game that I've played so far.

"Personally, I didn't get off to the best of starts at Gainsborough, but the lads dug me out of a hole a little bit, and at Fylde last Saturday they never stopped trying to get back into the game. We nearly pulled it back after Gary Brown scored, but then they made it 3-1.

"That never-say-die attitude can only be a big benefit and stand us in good stead over the rest of the season. We all believe that we can get into the play offs, and the three home games we have left will be crucial. Every game is going to be like a cup final."

Hello, and welcome to today's match against our visitors from Tamworth.

It's been a busy week, to say the least, with two significant events taking place.

Firstly, we had our match against AFC Fylde last Saturday. With second placed Kidderminster losing to Halifax, it looks as though Fylde's win against us will be their launchpad to the National League.

But it was also a match in which we saw a significant amount of trouble caused by a small group of people in the away section of the ground. I refuse to call them "fans", because bringing the club into disrepute is not the sort of behaviour that we want to be associated with. It would seem that the abuse, fighting, encroachment onto the playing area, and throwing of missiles was fuelled by alcohol, and we have photographs of what look like very young people holding alcoholic drinks on the terraces.

We have made our views on the serving of alcohol during the match known both to the officials at AFC Fylde, and to the police. But we do not think that alcohol being abused during the match was the sole reason for the trouble. There is clearly a core of individuals who seem intent on spoiling our reputation at away games. I must point out that the vast majority of our fans are great ambassadors for the club.

The biggest challenge that the Board faces in placing banning orders is putting names to faces. Once we have evidence of wrongdoing, we can take steps to prevent individuals from attending home matches. But preventing them from attending away matches is more difficult. However, we are now working with the Supporters Group to find a way to ensure that these people do not get into Darlington matches.

We have had a great response from fans to our plea for information. Lots of photographs, and eye witness statements. We have also been able to name individuals whom we believe were breaking the rules, and at the time of writing this piece we will be talking with our Police Liaison Officer about whether formal police action can be instigated. At the very least, and if we haven't already done so by the time you read this, we hope to have named individuals whom we believe have broken the rules.

All that negative activity at the beginning of the week took the shine off the fantastic news that we received on Monday that the FA Council has approved the change in our playing name back to "Darlington", dropping the "1883". The FA had its reasons for requiring us to make the change in 2012, and as I have said previously, there is no point in going over that old ground. So I would like to take the opportunity to thank the FA for listening to us, and for accepting the case that we made for allowing us to revert to our historic name.

You should note that the company that runs the football club will continue to be called Darlington 1883 Limited for the time being, and our majority shareholder Darlington 1883 Supporters Society Limited. However we will be looking at whether that decision should remain, or whether we should incur the cost of changing the company name too. But the important thing for now is that in 2017/18 season whichever results service you follow will report the scores for DARLINGTON!

All the more reason not to let a small group of individuals tarnish the image that we have waited for five years to regain. So if you have information about any individual who you have seen behaving improperly, please don't hesitate to contact dave.watson@darlingtonfc.org.

Meanwhile, back on the field, we welcome the players, manager and coaching staff, fans, directors and officials from Tamworth, and we wish them a safe journey home this evening.

BENEFIT GAME FOR JOEY HUTCHINSON



was a vouth team player at Birmingham City, and they are staging a special fixture in aid of the former defender on Saturday, 6th May (3pm)

The Birmingham team that won the play-off final at the Millennium Stadium during Hutchinson's time at the club. 2000-2003, are to reform and take on a Select XI at St Andrew's.

Trevor Francis, who gave Hutchinson his Blues debut, will manage the side that will include a host of former Birmingham players, including: Ian Bennett, Kevin Poole, Nicky Eaden, Jerry Gill, Michael Johnson, David Holdsworth, Darren Purse, Martin Grainger, Jon McCarthy, Martin O'Connor, Curtis Woodhouse, Graham Hyde, Dele Adebola, Paul Devlin, Paul Furlong and Geoff Horsfield. One of his closest friends, Andrew Johnson, who also played for Everton and Fulham, will also be involved in the fixture.

Tickets cost £5 for adults and £3 for under-16s with all monies raised going to help provide care for Hutchinson and his family.

Hutchinson joined Darlington in 2003 and was with the club for three and a half seasons, making most of his 86 Quakers appearances in his first year at the club.

Mick Tait was manager when he signed during the summer that the club moved to The Northern Echo Arena, though David Hodgson then took over and lavished praise on the centre-back.

Soon after being appointed Quakers boss in November 2003, Hodgson said of Hutchinson: "When I first arrived I

must admit I knew very little about Joey. In my first game at Hornchurch I made the mistake of leaving him on the bench. It was only after getting to know the lads that I realised what Joey was all about.

"He's a fantastic young player with a lot going for him. He's quick, reads the game well and knows exactly what's going on around him."

The following season bigger clubs were known to be keeping tabs on the young defender, with Swindon Town making an enguiry about him, leading then team-mate Craig Liddle to say: "If he continues to play like he has been then I think it is inevitable that he will play at a higher level.

"He's got everything a player needs to be a top class centre-half and I'm sure he will go on to bigger and better things. I would be very surprised if teams weren't watching him now because he has been outstanding in the seven games he has played this season."

However, Hutchinson's time with Quakers was curtailed by cruel luck with injury. He twice sustained a cruciate ligament damage, and after struggling to regain peak fitness he was released by Hodgson in February 2007, joining York City in August that year. After hanging up his boots he became a senior welding inspector.

A JustGiving page has been set up, where it says: "He is continuing the long hard process of further rehabilitation and learning to manage his physical needs each day adapting to life in a wheelchair.

"He is accessing therapies to assist with pain management, muscle strengthening and flexibility. These being fundamental to his physical and mental health. He is actively researching ground breaking spinal cord treatments around the world in the hope he can access a suitable programme of treatment to improve his hand function and or even eventually so he can walk again.

"Joev has amazed his family and friends in the way he has faced this life changing event. His determination has been an inspiration to us all. We are hear to give Joey and his family ongoing support on this difficult and unpredictable road ahead by raising funds on this page. Any donation will be gratefully received."

The 23-year-old goalkeeper, who was promoted to the senior squad by Gareth Southgate as back-up to Joe Hart last November, played for Quakers on loan from Sunderland in 2012.

AMAR PUREWAL scored a hattrick in Shildon's 5-1 win over Penrith on March 30.

Also among their scorers at Dean Street was LEWIS WING, who has agreed to join Middlesbrough at the end of the season.

The free-scoring midfielder played one game for Darlington in 2014, at home to Curzon Ashton.

Two former Darlington players



are in the Hereford squad that has have taken another step on their intended climb

back towards the Football League by winning a second successive promotion in the Southern League.

ROB PURDIE and CLAYTON FORTUNE are

both with the phoenix club, which was created following the demise of Hereford United in December 2014, who will

play in English football's seventh tier next season.

Purdie, a versatile performer, this season made his 400th appearance for Hereford having returned to the club in 2015, and played for them in the 2016 Vase final against Morpeth.

He had two seasons with Darlington, 2007-09. before following Dave Penney and Martin Gray to Oldham, but he did not play a game due to injury at Boundary Park.

Fortune signed for Hereford in November. He made seven appearances for Quakers in 2008-09.

Darlington moved up to fifth place in the table thanks to a Stephen Thompson powerblast against Brackley.

Considering that Quakers were missing their two regular centre halves, they never looked as if they would concede a goal, to record their second successive clean sheet and their fourth game in a row unbeaten.

Quakers nearly scored on 6 minutes, when Thompson crossed from the right, and Brackley defender Alex Gudger turned the ball towards the top corner of his own net, but keeper Laurie Walker just managed to claw the ball away.

Quakers had the ball in the net on 21 minutes when David Syers headed in a Thompson cross, but the ref penalised Terry Galbraith for a foul on the keeper.

Quakers had a chance on 24 minutes when Cartman cut in from the left and struck a low drive that Walker saved, then Syers had a shot blocked ten yards out after a good flowing move.

Quakers' early second half pressure was rewarded when they took the lead on 54 minutes. Beck and Syers both had attempts blocked in a crowded penalty area, but the ball ran on for Thompson to powerfully lash into the roof of the net from an acute angle for his sixth league goal of the season.

Quakers stayed firmly in control after that, and after a five minute stoppage because of a head injury to Brackley's Glenn Walker, they nearly got a second when Walker tipped Mark Beck's header from Galbraith's free kick over the bar.



HOW THE OTHERS ARE DOING

AFC Fylde's 4-1 defeat of Darlington last week sent them nine points clear at the top of the table. It was a quick recovery from the Coasters who lost by the same scoreline to Nuneaton a week earlier.

Their lead was extended as Kidderminster were beaten 2-1 at home by FC Halifax. It was a first defeat in five matches for Harriers, who do have a game in hand on Fylde.

That win for Halifax helped tighten their grip on a play-off place, and the Shaymen have a game in hand on the sides around them. The win was Halifax's third win in a row.

Fourth placed Salford are behind Halifax on goals scored but have played a game more. They won for the first time in four matches last week, as they came from behind to beat bottom club Altrincham.

Chorley moved into the final play-off spot with an easy 4-0 win over relegation-threatened Gainsborough. The Magpies are two points above Darlington, who are just outside the play-off spots.

Seventh placed Stockport are behind the Quakers on goal difference after drawing four and winning two of their last six.

Brackley Town followed up back-to-back wins against Worcester and AFC Telford with a draw against Boston last week, leaving them seven points behind the play-offs with a game in hand.

Level on points with Brackley are today's visitors Tamworth, who kept their play-off hopes flickering with victory over Harrogate.

However, Gloucester City, who are five games unbeaten, could only draw 0-0 at Curzon Ashton to slip nine points behind the top five.

And that defeat at Brackley all but ended Harrogate Town's play-off hopes. Despite having a game in hand, Town are 12 points off the top five.

12th-placed Curzon Ashton have lost just one of their last four games, as they sit comfortably in mid-table. They're a point ahead of FC United, who've taken four wins from their last seven to sit 16 points clear of the relegation zone.

Nuneaton Town have found good form in recent weeks, having lost just one of their last seven. That included a surprising 4-1 home win over leaders Fylde. The Boro have also taken points off play-off chasing Stockport in recent weeks.

Boston United lie 12 points clear of the drop zone after losing just one of their previous four matches, including a shock 2-0 win over playoff chasing Salford two weeks ago.

Two wins in a row have lifted AFC Telford out of relegation trouble. Their wins over Worcester City and Stalybridge Celtic mean the Bucks are nine points clear of the drop.

Telford are above Alfreton Town on goal difference. Alfreton still haven't fully secured their National League North status for next season after losing their last two.

Having at one stage looked doomed, Bradford Park Avenue are close to ensuring their survival. They've won six out of 10 matches to be level on points with Telford and Alfreton.

Bottom club Altrincham were relegated last weekend after their defeat to Salford.

Stalybridge look almost certain to join them, lying 13 points from safety with no wins in their previous four.

The final spot is likely to be taken by Worcester or Gainsborough Trinity.

Trinity currently occupy that place, having failed to win any of their last 10 games. They're two points behind Worcester, whose run of form is just as bad, having taken only one victory from their previous 20 league games.

Weatherill looks back to the 3-2 home

The Quakers had started the 65/66 season in unspectacular fashion, winning only one of their first six league fixtures. so there was very little hint of the exciting season that lay ahead. Scunthorpe had been beaten in the first round of the League Cup, a victory that set up a home tie against Swindon in round two. The aftermath of that cup tie transformed Darlington's season and set them on the road to promotion. Swindon were beaten 2-1 but they were so impressed with home centre forward Jimmy Lawton that they immediately put a bid in for him. Lawton was transferred to the Wiltshire club for £8,000. with midfielder Alan Sproates moving in the opposite direction as part of the deal. Manager Lol Morgan then went out and spent the bulk of the transfer money on a replacement for Lawton, signing Bobby Cummings from Newcastle. The introduction of Sproates and Cummings to the team had an immediate impact as the club went on a run of only one defeat in their next 15 games, catapulting them to the verge of the promotion race. (Cummings had contributed 13 goals in those 15 games.) Manager Morgan further strengthened his squad in

the February when he signed two experienced players to help with the promotion push, bringing in Don Ratcliffe from Middlesbrough and Barry Hutchinson from Lincoln City.

April 1966.

The battle for promotion featured seven teams and no one ever ran away with things at the top as everyone's form fluctuated. At the beginning of April, one point separated the top six clubs and it had become a question of who could hold their nerve best in the hectic run in. By the time Doncaster Rovers arrived at Feethams on Easter Monday, April 11th, both clubs were well placed in the promotion race. Darlington sat in 6th place with 45 points from 36 games. Rovers were in 4th place, one point better off from the same number of games. Both clubs had games in hand on the teams around them and stood a good chance of claiming one of the four promotion places. The Quakers had no injury worries and manager Lol Morgan named an unchanged side for the fifth game in a row.

A sizeable following from South Yorkshire swelled the crowd as 12181 packed into Feethams for the holiday fixture. They witnessed a tense opening to the game with neither side wanting to give their opponents an opening. The visitors' midfield controlled the opening stages but it was the Quakers who created and missed the better opportunities. Rovers grabbed the lead after 26 minutes. Inside left Tony Coleman hit a shot that was brilliantly turned around the post by Tony Moor in the home goal. Coleman himself took the resulting flag kick and inside right Alick Jeffrey burst between two defenders to head the inswinging corner into the roof of the net.

Minutes later Jeffrey could have put the visitors in total control but he missed an absolute sitter, shooting wide when faced with an open goal. The Quakers fought back and deservedly equalised in the 36th minute. George McGeachie and John Peverell made progress down the right with good interplay, before Peverell found outside left Les O'Neill with a cross field pass. O'Neill swung the ball into the box first time where it was met by Barry Hutchinson, who headed home. The match was living up to its billing as a promotion showdown and the teams left the pitch at half time with honours even, 1-1. The Quakers began the second half in fine style. with McGeachie especially prominent. In one action



packed spell he had two shots blocked and two crosses turned away by desperate defenders.

Then, on 49 minutes, the Quakers took the lead that their pressure deserved. Brian Keeble hit a fierce drive that was blocked by a defender and ran out wide to O'Neill. He fired in a cross, which again found the head of Hutchinson who made no mistake, past visiting keeper Harry Fearnley. The home side continued to pile forward as they took complete control, playing some of their best football of the season. Hutchinson had two chances to complete his hat trick, missing narrowly on both occasions, before Don Ratcliffe added a brilliant solo goal on the hour. He dispossessed Coleman in midfield before dribbling straight through the centre of the Rovers defence before slipping the ball past the advancing Fearnley. At 3-1

the game should have been over but Darlington gave their visitors hope by conceding a needless penalty in the 73rd minute when Ratcliffe brought down Jeffrey. Coleman made no mistake from the spot to set up a nervous last 17 minutes. Rovers threw men forward looking for an equaliser but it was the Quakers who went closer to scoring again. Keeble had a header scrambled off the line, then Bobby Cummings hit a drive inches wide. The large crowd had been brilliantly entertained and Darlington had just held out to claim a 3-2 win.

Quakers eventually clinched promotion with a goalless draw in their last game against Torquay. Doncaster and Darlington both finished on 59 points, but Rovers were champions due to their superior goal average. Torquay finished third with 58 points and in the mad scramble behind them, Colchester grabbed the fourth promotion spot on goal average from Tranmere and Luton. All three sides had finished on 56 points. .

The programme for the 65/66 season consisted of 12 pages and cost 4d. The front cover showed a drawing of two players competing for the ball and was printed in a variety of colours including blue, pink, white or yellow. Inside was Club Jottings (with news of what was happening around the club), an action photo from a previous game, team line-ups, half time scoreboard, fixtures and results from first and reserve teams, and pen pictures of our opponents. Amazingly, considering the exciting and successful season that the club was enjoying. there was no room for a league table!

A goal six minutes into stoppage time by David Syers earned Quakers a valuable but heart-stopping point at Northholme.

Quakers were 3-1 down midway through the second half, but once again they showed their character and kept their play off campaign well and truly on track.

They seemed to be on course for a routine win after 11 minutes. Chris Hunter launched the ball forward into the Gainsborough area from inside his own half, and Mark Beck outjumped the defence as the keeper came out, and the ball landed in the net for his 15th league goal of the season.

Beck popped up on his own line when he cleared a shot by Chris Salt following a corner, but Quakers went down the other end and nearly got a second. Beck's shot was parried as far as Thompson who drilled the ball across the face of goal, and David Syers, sliding in at the far post, put the ball wide.

Gainsborough levelled out of the blue on 34 minutes, when a free kick came over from the right from Greg Tempest, and Matt Wilson headed past debutant keeper Adam Bartlett, and a minute later Quakers were stunned when Ashley Worsfold ran clear and poked the ball past the stranded keeper.

It was 3-1 five minutes after half time. A long throw came in from the right, Chab Chilaka headed against the crossbar, and he was first to react to the loose ball and poked the ball in.

Quakers rolled up their sleeves and got back into the game on 75 minutes, when sub Josh Gillies crossed into the box, Beck headed towards goal, and even though the ball was blocked, Syers reacted first and headed in.

Quakers piled forward in the closing stages. Syers had a shot blocked, man of the match Josh Falkingham curled one just wide, and sub Harvey Saunders headed just past the post.

But Quakers' non stop pressure paid off in the sixth minute of stoppage time when Falkingham crossed from the left and the ball bounced off a defender on the six yard line for the alert Syers to knock the ball past the wrong footed keeper.





In home games last season, there were incidents involving a flare, some coin throwing and fans encroaching on to the field of play. Accordingly, we have been requested to remind fans about our ground regulations.

These regrettable incidents are contrary to our ground regulations, as published on our official website on 12th October last year, and again last week.

The pertinent regulations are as follows:

"The following articles must not be brought within the Ground - knives, fireworks or any other pyrotechnics, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, glass bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles, any articles that are prohibited by the Rules and Regulations, and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to (or ejected from) the Ground."

And

"Under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended) the following are offences for which a person can be arrested by a police officer and conviction could result in a Banning Order being made under the Football Spectators Act 1989 (as amended): The list is non-exhaustive.

"The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse:

"The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse "

We should be very clear. Those responsible for such incidents simply do not care about our club, our reputation or the safety of our fans and we do not want them at our matches. The club will work with the stewards and police to ensure that these matters are addressed and the individuals will be banned from future matches

Ensuring the safety of our supporters and staff is always of paramount importance to Darlington FC 1883. If such behaviour was to continue, the reality is it would only be a matter of time before serious injury is caused and the club in turn would be punished by the league and/or the FA. We will not allow safety to be compromised of the well-behaved and sensible majority by the actions of a tiny minority.

We would also like to draw attention to the possession of pyrotechnics

As a member Club participating in The National League we have been directed to take the strongest action available against anyone found in possession of a Flare, Smoke Bomb or any other such pyrotechnic article(s).

Spectators are warned that we and The National League apply a zero tolerance approach to anyone attempting to bring such article(s) into our Ground/ Stadium.

Due to their chemical makeup, a Flare, Smoke Bomb and all such pyrotechnic article(s) can be highly toxic for some people. This can lead to serious health consequences for those with pre-existing medical conditions and may in certain circumstances cause lifethreatening injury or concern.

In order to protect you, the spectator, we reserve the right to search your person and/or effects and we further reserve the right to pursue legal action, civil or criminal, against any person who contravenes current legislation or our Ground/ Stadium regulations.

To further safeguard all who attend any event at this Ground/ Stadium, we welcome the receipt of any information which will assist us to deter, apprehend/detain and where appropriate prosecute, anyone in possession of; or found discharging or being a party to the discharge of, such an article(s).

The undoubted highlight this week has been the announcement that the FA have approved our name change back to Darlington, allowing us to drop the four digits that have been a constant reminder of the treatment which was meted out to the Club in 2012.

To most of our supporters we've always been Darlington FC and always will be, but the FA ruling rubber stamps that from the beginning of next season we will end five full seasons of having to play under the Darlington 1883 tag - constantly battling with league tables showing those pesky digits and mischievous rival teams often including them.

Thanks goes to all DFCSG members who voted in our poll - proving to the FA the level of importance that this decision held -- and also the various supporter organisations such as Supporters Direct who championed our cause.

And a special thanks must of course go to the DFC Directors, in particular Jonathan Jowett who put together the case to the FA for the name change to be considered and ultimately accepted.

The name change following on the back of our return home to Darlington at the turn of the year is the final piece of the jigsaw in returning the club to where we would have been in 2012, all done under volunteer steam with the club in a much more stable state in a ground which is much more. The first five years have been nothing but a huge success and credit should go to everyone involved. But our work is not done.....now more than ever we need everyone to pull together to take us to the next level. The boards of DFC and DFCSG have been working hard in planning what is needed over the next five years to keep the club moving forwards by developing the Blackwell Meadows ground and building a team to

continue to progress up the leagues. We'll be looking to make this plan

we to be tooking to make this plan public in the coming weeks in readiness for the fundraising launch at the fans forum on 21st April.

For those who helped the Club return home by purchasing Community Shares we recently sent out an update to let you know how that investment has been spent. The update can be read below and contains some more details of the schemes we'll be launching on the 21st:

These improvements included;

- the installation of the Terracing and Cover for the New Tin Shed,
- 294 covered seats in the new South stand,
- 2 turnstile blocks, one at each end of the ground,
- two toilet blocks, one at at each end of the ground,
- a new pitch perimeter fence and ground boundary fence,
- extensive areas of paving.

Also as promised, DGCSG have already started to set aside money that will be needed to start repaying your capital, with interest, after the five year minimum investment period.

Thanks to your investment, the foundations are now in place for us to build a football club that is financially stable and playing football at the highest sustainable level. And, even more importantly, to safeguard the future of Darlington Football Club for future generations of Quakers' supporters. However, there is still a long journey and a lot of work to do before we achieve these objectives.

Constant progress for long term results

Unlike the first offer which had a single target, this second offer will be more ambitious and have at least three milestone targets each linked to a specific set of ground improvements aimed at qualifying DFC to play at National League level and also to improve the Match Day Experience.

We are also going to roll out a new initiative that will allow DFCSG members to donate an additional voluntary subscription each month. Initially every penny of this will go directly to Martin's playing budget. Over time we hope to provide additional options that will enable our members to shape the future of the club by choosing to invest this additional subscription in such things as youth development, infrastructure improvement, community engagement etc.

So once again thanks for your generous investment and we hope we can rely on your continued support as we progress on this exciting and challenging journey.
