Good evening everybody and welcome to the game.

Today sees the visit of the current league leaders Salford City, who despite a recent dip in form remain top of the league. Our first game of the season was away to Salford and we returned deserved winners following an entertaining game, but today will prove to be a very difficult test against the side who everyone was predicting would win the league this season and will continue to set the standard of the remainder of the season

Recent results have been disappointing for us as we have gone through significant changes in both managerial and playing staff. It always takes time for a side to settle following such changes whilst players and staff get used to new formations and tactics employed. Whilst I am not one to bemoan bad luck, we do seem to have been punished in recent games for every mistake we have made either individually or collectively. The game against York was obviously a very emotive game for everyone concerned as it saw the return of Martin Gray for the first time since leaving to manage York. I thought we were very unlucky not to take something out of the game and at half time we had been the better side and fully deserved our lead with a great goal from Reece. Ten crazy minutes into the second half we found ourselves 2-1 behind and we were then chasing the game but despite having many chances we ultimately lost again which was extremely disappointing. As we stand today, we need to start to turn around our recent disappointing form and what better place to start than this evening.

Tommy is continuing to look at the squad and we will look to support him as he shapes the squad for the remainder of this season and beyond. The development of talent is a key area that we want to improve moving forward. Bringing players through our ranks who can play at this level and getting the right blend with experienced players is a great model to develop from a financial perspective, and we will look to strengthen where we need to.

I firmly believe this club has a great future and we are involved in discussions with various parties regarding the Sporting Village concept. We will look to secure the right commercial deals that benefit DFC to enable a sustainable financial future together with increased revenue to support our ambitions to play at a higher level. The key priorities however for the remainder of this season are as follows:

- · Secure National League North status
- · Clear the legacy debt by February 2018
- Deliver a breakeven profit/loss for the first time since the club reformed

The club can then set realistic budgets and targets for the following season whilst we understand the Council's position regarding future sporting development in the town. We need to be ready to move quickly once this position is known and the club will look to develop income-generating assets to support our ongoing development.

Sadly, I must mention some disgraceful behaviour that I witnessed at our home game against York City. The verbal abuse directed at our guests in the Boardroom area from so-called Darlington fans was both cowardly and disgusting. When I tried to intervene to calm the situation, I was also subject to vile and abusive comments in front of my family. >>
